3	(b) RETROACTIVE APPLICATION FOR CERTAIN LIQ-
4	UIDATIONS AND RELIQUIDATIONS.—
5	(1) In general.—Notwithstanding section 514
6	of the Tariff Act of 1930 or any other provision of
7	law, and subject to paragraph (2), the entry—
8	(A) of any article to which duty-free treat-
9	ment under title V of the Trade Act of 1974
10	would have applied if the entry had been made
11	on September 30, 2001,
12	(B) that was made after September 30,
13	2001, and before the date of the enactment of
14	this Act, and
15	(C) to which duty-free treatment under
16	title V of that Act did not apply,
17	shall be liquidated or reliquidated as free of duty,
18	and the Secretary of the Treasury shall refund any
19	duty paid with respect to such entry. As used in this
20	subsection, the term "entry" includes a withdrawal
21	from warehouse for consumption.
22	(2) Requests.—Liquidation or reliquidation
23	may be made under paragraph (1) with respect to
24	an entry only if a request therefor is filed with the

Customs Service, within 180 days after the date of
