A BILL

To allow letters sent to the White House, marked "America's Fund for Afghan Children", to be mailed free of postage.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Supporting the Goals
- 5 of the 'America's Fund for Afghan Children' Act''.
- 6 SEC. 2. FREE POSTAGE.
- 7 (a) In General.—Chapter 34 of title 39, United
- 8 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-
- 9 lowing:

1 "§ 3407. America's Fund for Afghan Children

- 2 "(a) The matter described in subsection (b) may be
- 3 mailed free of postage.
- 4 "(b) The free mailing privilege provided by subsection
- 5 (a) applies with respect to any letters sent to the White
- 6 House bearing the words 'America's Fund for Afghan
- 7 Children', or words to that effect, as the Postal Service
- 8 may specify.
- 9 "(c) This section shall cease to apply after such date
- 10 as the President (or his designee) may determine.".
- 11 (b) Technical and Conforming Amendments.—
- 12 (1) The analysis for chapter 34 of title 39, United States
- 13 Code, is amended by adding at the end the following: "3407. America's Fund for Afghan Children.".
- 14 (2) Sections 2401(c) and 3627 of title 39, United
- 15 States Code, are amended by striking "3406" and insert-
- 16 ing "3407".
