A BILL

To amend section 404 of the Medicare, Medicaid, and SCHIP Benefits Improvement and Protection Act of 2000 with respect to application of employment criteria under management contracts for certain mental health facilities.

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. CONTINUING CRITERIA FOR MANAGEMENT**
2 **CONTRACTS FOR PROVIDER-BASED STATUS**
3 **UNDER PART B OF THE MEDICARE PROGRAM**
4 **FOR CERTAIN MENTAL HEALTH FACILITIES.**

5 Section 404 of the Medicare, Medicaid, and SCHIP
6 Benefits Improvement and Protection Act of 2000 (113
7 Stat. 2763A–506), as enacted into law by section 1(a)(6)
8 of Public Law 106–554, is amended by adding at the end
9 the following new subsection:

10 “(e) GRANDFATHER OF MANAGEMENT CONTRACTS
11 WITH CERTAIN MENTAL HEALTH FACILITIES.—Notwith-
12 standing subsections (a) and (b), with respect to deter-
13 minations of provider-based status on or after January 20,
14 2001, a facility or organization that provides inpatient
15 psychiatric services and other mental health services shall
16 be exempt from the restrictions on managements contracts
17 under section 413.65(f)(1) of title 42, Code of Federal
18 Regulations insofar as they apply to employment of all
19 staff, if the facility or organization—

20 “(1) is managed and staffed by employees of a
21 unit of State or local government pursuant to a pub-
22 lic-private affiliation that was entered into before
23 such date; and

24 “(2) assures access to mental health services
25 for low-income individuals who are not entitled to
26 benefits under title XVIII of the Social Security Act

- 1 or to medical assistance under a State plan under
- 2 title XIX of such Act.”.

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
