1 SEC. 2. STUDY AND REPORT TO CONGRESS REQUIRED.

- 2 (a) STUDY.—The Comptroller General shall conduct3 a study on—
- 4 (1) the systems under which Federal agencies 5 declare levels of alert in cases of emergencies; and
- (2) an appropriate uniform standard for such
 agencies for declaring such levels of alert.
- 8 (b) Report.—Not later than three months after the 9 date of the enactment of this Act, the Comptroller General 10 shall submit to Congress a report describing the findings 11 of the study conducted under subsection (a), including rec-12 ommendations for how a uniform standard for Federal 13 agencies for declaring levels of alert in cases of emer-
