## A BILL

To prohibit Federal payments to any individual, business, institution, or organization that engages in human cloning.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Human Cloning Pre-
- 5 vention Act of 2001".
- 6 SEC. 2. PROHIBITION.
- 7 (a) General Rule.—Except as provided in sub-
- 8 section (b), no Federal agency shall—
- 9 (1) make any grant, contract, or other pay-
- ment; or

- 1 (2) enter into any obligation for making any
- 2 such grant, contract, or payment,
- 3 to any individual, business, institution, or organization
- 4 that within the past one year has engaged in human
- 5 cloning, or to any individual, business, institution, or orga-
- 6 nization that controls, is controlled by, or is under com-
- 7 mon control with any individual, business, institution, or
- 8 organization that within the past one year has engaged
- 9 in human cloning.
- 10 (b) Exception.—Subsection (a)(1) shall not apply
- 11 to any payment a Federal agency is obligated to make.
- 12 SEC. 3. DEFINITION.
- For purposes of this Act, the term "human cloning"
- 14 means making an identical, or substantially identical, copy
- 15 of the genetic material of an individual human being, liv-
- 16 ing or deceased, including embryos and fetuses, for the
- 17 cultivation of human cells which could develop into a new
- 18 individual human being.

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
