Mr. JEFF MILLER of Florida introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Armed Services

A BILL

To amend title 10, United States Code, to repeal the four-year requirement for the time following retirement from active duty during which a retired member of the Armed Forces must have received a disability rating in order to be eligible for the special disability compensation provided under section 1413 of that title.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. REPEAL OF FOUR-YEAR DISABILITY DETER-
2 MINATION REQUIREMENT FOR ELIGIBILITY
3 FOR SPECIAL DISABILITY COMPENSATION.**

4 (a) REPEAL OF FOUR-YEAR REQUIREMENT.—Section 1413(d)(2) of title 10, United States Code, is amended by striking “disabling—” and all that follows through “uniformed services.” and inserting “disabling.”.

8 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by subsection (a) shall take effect on the first day of the first month beginning on or after the date of the enactment of this Act and shall apply to payments under section 1413 of title 10, United States Code, for months that begin on or after that date.
