Mr. Hart introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Government Reform

A BILL

To require the Director of the Office of Management and Budget to include an outlying county in a metropolitan statistical area if the county meets certain requirements.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. REQUIREMENT TO INCLUDE CERTAIN OUT-
- 4 LYING COUNTIES IN A METROPOLITAN STA-
- 5 TISTICAL AREA.
- 6 In determining a metropolitan statistical area, the
- 7 Director of the Office of Management and Budget shall
- 8 include an outlying county in such metropolitan statistical
- 9 area if the county meets the following requirements:

- (1) Between 15 and 20 percent of the employed residents of the outlying county are employed in the central county or counties of the metropolitan statistical area.
 - (2) Between 15 and 25 percent of the individuals employed in the outlying county are individuals who reside in the central county or counties of the metropolitan statistical area.
 - (3) The outlying county has combined with the central county or counties of the metropolitan statistical area as part of a metropolitan planning organization or is part of a regional area designated by a Federal agency for purposes of providing funds.
