## A BILL

To extend the deadlines under part I of the Federal Power Act for commencement of construction of two hydroelectric projects in the State of New York.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF TIME FOR FEDERAL ENERGY
- 4 REGULATORY COMMISSION PROJECT.
- 5 (a) In General.—Notwithstanding the time period
- 6 specified in section 13 of the Federal Power Act (16
- 7 U.S.C. 806) that would otherwise apply to Federal Energy
- 8 Regulatory Commission projects numbered 4244 and
- 9 10648, the Commission shall, at the request of the licensee

- 1 for the projects and after reasonable notice, in accordance
- 2 with the good faith, due diligence, and public interest re-
- 3 quirements of that section and the Commission's proce-
- 4 dures under that section, extend the time period during
- 5 which the licensee is required to commence the construc-
- 6 tion of these projects for 3 consecutive 2-year periods.
- 7 (b) Effective Date.—Subsection (a) shall take ef-
- 8 fect on the expiration of each of the extensions issued by
- 9 the Commission for Federal Energy Regulatory Commis-
- 10 sion projects numbered 4244 and 10648.
- 11 (c) Reinstatement of Expired Licenses.—If ei-
- 12 ther or both of the periods required for commencement
- 13 of construction of the projects described in subsection (a)
- 14 have expired prior to the date of the enactment of this
- 15 Act, the Commission shall reinstate the license for the ex-
- 16 pired project effective as of the date of its expiration, and
- 17 the first extension authorized under subsection (a) shall
- 18 take effect on the date of such expiration.
