A BILL

To establish an Office of Consumer Advocacy within the Department of Justice to represent the consumers of electricity and natural gas in proceeding before the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. FEDERAL ENERGY REGULATORY COMMISSION
- 4 OFFICE OF CONSUMER ADVOCACY.
- 5 (a) Definitions.—In this section:

1	(1) Commission.—The term "Commission"
2	means the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission.
3	(2) Natural gas company.—The term "nat-
4	ural gas company" has the meaning given that term
5	in section 2 of the Natural Gas Act (15 U.S.C.
6	717a), as modified by section 601(a) of the natural
7	Gas Policy Act of 1978 (15 U.S.C. 3431a).
8	(3) Office.—The term "Office" means the Of-
9	fice of Consumer Advocacy established by subsection
10	(b)(1).
11	(4) Public utility.—The term "public util-
12	ity" means public utility as defined in section 201(e)
13	of the Federal Power Act.
14	(4) Consumers.—The term 'consumers of elec-
15	tricity or natural gas' means only—
16	(A) residential consumers of electricity or
17	natural gas,
18	(B) commercial consumers of electricity
19	having a peak electric demand of not more than
20	1,000 kilowatts; and
21	(C) commercial consumers of natural gas
22	having a peak demand of not more than 150
23	million cubic feet.
24	(b) Office.—

1	(1) Establishment.—There is established
2	within the Department of Justice an Office of Con-
3	sumer Advocacy.
4	(2) DIRECTOR.—The Office shall be headed by
5	a Director to be appointed by the President, by and
6	, , , , , , , , , , , , , , , , , , ,
	with the advice and consent of the Senate.
7	(3) Duties.—The Office may—
8	(A) represent, and appeal on behalf of,
9	consumers of electricity or natural gas provided
10	(directly or indirectly) by public utilities, or nat-
11	ural gas companies, under the jurisdiction of
12	the Commission—
13	(i) at hearings of the Commission;
14	(ii) in judicial proceedings in the
15	courts of the United States; and
16	(iii) at hearings or proceedings of
17	other Federal regulatory agencies and com-
18	missions;
19	(B) investigate independently, or within
20	the context of formal proceedings before the
21	Commission, the services provided by, the rates
22	charged by, and the valuation of the properties
23	of, public utilities, and natural gas companies,
24	under the jurisdiction of the Commission:

- (C) develop means, such as public dissemination of information, consultative services, and technical assistance, to ensure, to the maximum extent practicable, that the interests of consumers of electricity or natural gas provided by public utilities, or natural gas companies, under the jurisdiction of the Commission are adequately represented in the course of any hearing or proceeding described in subparagraph (A); and
 - (D) petition the Federal Trade Commission or regional transmission organizations to take actions to protect the interests of consumers of electricity or natural gas provided (directly or indirectly), by public utilities, or natural gas companies, within the respective jurisdictions of the Federal Trade Commission or regional transmission organizations; and
 - (E) propose legislation on matters relating to the Commission, evaluate the impact of legislation on such matters on consumers of electricity or natural gas, and testify before Congress concerning legislation on such matters.
- 24 (c) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There 25 are authorized to be appropriated \$25,000,000 for each

- 2 carry out this section.
