# A BILL

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- This Act may be cited as the "1993 World Trade
- 3 Center Victims Compensation Act".

# 4 TITLE I—COMPENSATION

## 5 **PROVISIONS**

#### 6 SEC. 101. DEFINITIONS.

- 7 In this title, the following definitions apply:
- 8 (1) Claimant.—The term "claimant" means
- 9 an individual filing a claim for compensation under
- 10 section 104(a)(1).
- 11 (2) COLLATERAL SOURCE.—The term "collat-
- eral source" means all collateral sources, including
- life insurance, pension funds, death benefit pro-
- grams, and payments by Federal, State, or local
- governments related to the terrorist-related bombing
- of the World Trade Center in New York City on
- 17 February 26, 1993.
- 18 (3) Economic Loss.—The term "economic
- loss" means any pecuniary loss resulting from harm
- 20 (including the loss of earnings or other benefits re-
- 21 lated to employment, medical expense loss, replace-
- 22 ment services loss, loss due to death, burial costs,
- and loss of business or employment opportunities) to
- 24 the extent recovery for such loss is allowed under ap-
- 25 plicable State law.

- 1 (4) ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUAL.—The term "eligible 2 individual" means an individual determined to be eli-3 gible for compensation under section 104(c).
  - (5) Noneconomic losses.—The term "noneconomic losses" means losses for physical and emotional pain, suffering, inconvenience, physical impairment, mental anguish, disfigurement, loss of enjoyment of life, loss of society and companionship, loss of consortium (other than loss of domestic service), hedonic damages, injury to reputation, and all other nonpecuniary losses of any kind or nature.
  - (6) SPECIAL MASTER.—The term "Special Master" means the Special Master appointed under section 404(a) of the September 11th Victim Compensation Fund of 2001 (title IV of the Air Transportation Safety and System Stabilization Act (Public Law 107–42; 115 Stat. \_\_\_\_)).

#### 18 **SEC. 102. PURPOSE.**

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- 19 It is the purpose of this title to provide compensation
- 20 to any individual (or relatives of a deceased individual)
- 21 who was physically injured or killed as a result of the ter-
- 22 rorist-related bombing of the World Trade Center in New
- 23 York City on February 26, 1993.

### 4 1 SEC. 103. ADMINISTRATION. 2 (a) In General.—The Attorney General, acting 3 through the Special Master, shall— 4 (1) administer the compensation program es-5 tablished under this title; 6 (2) promulgate all procedural and substantive 7 rules for the administration of this title; and 8 (3) employ and supervise hearing officers and 9 other administrative personnel to perform the duties 10 of the Special Master under this title. 11 (b) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There are authorized to be appropriated such sums as may be 13 necessary to pay the administrative and support costs for

- 16 PENSATION.
- 17 (a) FILING OF CLAIM.—
- 18 (1) IN GENERAL.—A claimant may file a claim
  19 for compensation under this title with the Special
  20 Master. The claim shall be on the form developed
  21 under paragraph (2) and shall state the factual basis
  22 for eligibility for compensation and the amount of
  23 compensation sought.
- 24 (2) Claim form.—
- 25 (A) IN GENERAL.—The Special Master 26 shall develop a claim form that claimants shall

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| 2  | (1). The Special Master shall ensure that such     |
| 3  | form can be filed electronically, if determined    |
| 4  | to be practicable.                                 |
| 5  | (B) CONTENTS.—The form developed                   |
| 6  | under subparagraph (A) shall request—              |
| 7  | (i) information from the claimant con-             |
| 8  | cerning the physical harm that the claim-          |
| 9  | ant suffered, or in the case of a claim filed      |
| 10 | on behalf of a decedent information con-           |
| 11 | firming the decedent's death, as a result of       |

| 23 | (3) Limitation.—No claim may be filed under        |

| 3  | (b) REVIEW AND DETERMINATION.—                       |
| 4  | (1) Review.—The Special Master shall review          |
| 5  | a claim submitted under subsection (a) and           |

| 7  | (A) whether the claimant is an eligible in-          |
| 8  | dividual under subsection (c);                       |
| 9  | (B) with respect to a claimant determined            |
| 10 | to be an eligible individual—                        |
| 11 | (i) the extent of the harm to the                    |
| 12 | claimant, including any economic and non-            |
| 13 | economic losses; and                                 |
| 14 | (ii) the amount of compensation to                   |
| 15 | which the claimant is entitled based on the          |
| 16 | harm to the claimant, the facts of the               |
| 17 | claim, and the individual circumstances of           |
| 18 | the claimant.  |
| 19 | (2) Negligence.—With respect to a claimant,          |
| 20 | the Special Master shall not consider negligence or  |
| 21 | any other theory of liability.                       |
| 22 | (3) Determination.—Not later than 120 days           |
| 23 | after that date on which a claim is filed under sub- |
| 24 | section (a), the Special Master shall complete a re- |
| 25 | view, make a determination, and provide written no-  |

| 1  | tice to the claimant, with respect to the matters that |
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| 2  | were the subject of the claim under review. Such a     |
| 3  | determination shall be final and not subject to judi-  |
| 4  | cial review.   |
| 5  | (4) RIGHTS OF CLAIMANT.—A claimant in a re-            |

| 10 | the presentation of witnesses and documents;           |

| 19 | Master shall reduce the amount of compensation de-     |

| 21 | of the collateral source compensation the claimant     |
| 22 | has received or is entitled to receive as a result of  |
| 23 | the terrorist-related bombing of the World Trade       |
| 24 | Center in New York City on February 26, 1993.          |

(c) ELIGIBILITY.—

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| 1  | (1) In general.—A claimant shall be deter-            |
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| 2  | mined to be an eligible individual for purposes of    |
| 3  | this subsection if the Special Master determines that |
| 4  | such claimant—  |
| 5  | (A) is an individual described in paragraph           |
| 6  | (2); and  |
| 7  | (B) meets the requirements of paragraph               |
| 8  | (3).  |
| 9  | (2) Individuals.—A claimant is an individual          |
| 10 | described in this paragraph if the claimant is—       |
| 11 | (A) an individual who—                                |
| 12 | (i) was present at the World Trade                    |
| 13 | Center in New York City at the time, or               |
| 14 | in the immediate aftermath, of the ter-               |
| 15 | rorist-related bombing of the World Trade             |
| 16 | Center in New York City on February 26,               |
| 17 | 1993;   |
| 18 | (ii) suffered physical harm or death as               |
| 19 | a result of such bombing; and                         |
| 20 | (iii) is not identified by the Attorney               |
| 21 | General to have been a participant or con-            |
| 22 | spirator in such bombing; or                          |
| 23 | (B) in the case of a decedent who is an in-           |
| 24 | dividual described in subparagraph (A), the per-      |

sonal representative of the decedent who files a claim on behalf of the decedent.

#### (3) Requirements.—

(A) SINGLE CLAIM.—Not more than one claim may be submitted under this title by an individual or on behalf of a deceased individual.

#### (B) Limitation on civil action.—

- (i) IN GENERAL.—Upon the submission of a claim under this title, the claimant waives the right to file a civil action (or to be a party to an action) in any Federal or State court for damages sustained as a result of the terrorist-related bombing of the World Trade Center in New York City on February 26, 1993. The preceding sentence does not apply to a civil action to recover collateral source obligations.
- (ii) Pending actions.—In the case of an individual who is a party to a civil action described in clause (i), such individual may not submit a claim under this title unless such individual withdraws from such action by the date that is 90 days after the date on which regulations are promulgated under section 106.

#### SEC. 105. PAYMENTS TO ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUALS.

- 2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 20 days after the
- 3 date on which a determination is made by the Special Mas-
- 4 ter regarding the amount of compensation due a claimant
- 5 under this title, the Special Master shall authorize pay-
- 6 ment to such claimant of the amount determined with re-
- 7 spect to the claimant.
- 8 (b) Payment Authority.—This title constitutes
- 9 budget authority in advance of appropriations Acts and
- 10 represents the obligation of the Federal Government to
- 11 provide for the payment of amounts for compensation
- 12 under this title.
- (c) Additional Funding.—
- 14 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Attorney General is au-
- thorized to accept such amounts as may be contrib-
- 16 uted by individuals, business concerns, or other enti-
- ties to carry out this title, under such terms and
- 18 conditions as the Attorney General may impose.
- 19 (2) Use of separate account.—In making
- payments under this section, amounts contained in
- any account containing funds provided under para-
- graph (1) shall be used prior to using appropriated
- amounts.
- 24 SEC. 106. REGULATIONS.
- Not later than 90 days after the date of enactment
- 26 of this Act, the Attorney General, in consultation with the

| 14 | The United States shall have the right of subrogation     |

| 17 | TITLE II—INCOME TAX                                       |
| 18 | PROVISIONS  |
| 19 | SEC. 201. INCOME TAX RELIEF.                              |
| 20 | (a) In General.—Section 692(d)(4) of the Internal         |
| 21 | Revenue Code of 1986 (relating to definition of specified |
| 22 | terrorist victim) is amended by inserting "February 26,   |
| 23 | 1993," before "April 19, 1995".                           |
| 24 | (b) Effective Date: Waiver of Limitations.—               |

- (1) Effective Date.—The amendment made by this section shall apply to taxable years ending before, on, or after the date of the enactment of this Act.
  - (2) Waiver of limitations.—If refund or credit of any overpayment of tax resulting from the amendment made by this section is prevented at any time before the close of the 1-year period beginning on the date of the enactment of this Act by the operation of any law or rule of law (including res judicata), such refund or credit may nevertheless be made or allowed if claim therefor is filed before the close of such period.

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
