A BILL

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. DISCIPLINARY ACTION FOR CERTAIN INS EM-
- 4 PLOYEES BASED ON FBI POLICIES AND PRO-
- 5 CEDURES.
- 6 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the At-
- 7 torney General is authorized and directed to impose dis-

- 1 ciplinary action, including termination of employment,
- 2 pursuant to policies and procedures applicable to employ-
- 3 ees of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, for any em-
- 4 ployee of the Immigration and Naturalization Service who
- 5 violates policies and procedures set forth by the Depart-
- 6 ment of Justice relative to the granting of citizenship or
- 7 who willfully deceives the Congress or department leader-
- 8 ship on any matter.
- 9 SEC. 2. ELIMINATING RESTRICTIONS ON CERTAIN DIS-
- 10 CIPLINARY AND OTHER ADVERSE ACTIONS
- 11 TAKEN AGAINST INS EMPLOYEES.
