5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1814 of the Revised Stat6 utes (40 U.S.C. 187) is amended by adding at the end
7 the following new sentence: "For purposes of this section,
8 the term 'State' shall include the District of Columbia.".

(b) CONFORMING AMENDMENT REGARDING PROCE DURES FOR REPLACEMENT OF STATUES.—Section 311 of
 the Legislative Branch Appropriations Act, 2001, as en acted into law by reference under section 1(a)(2) of the
 Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2001 (Public Law 106 554; 114 Stat. 2763A-119), is amended by adding at the
 end the following new subsection:

8 "(f) For purposes of this section—

9 "(1) the term 'State' shall include the District10 of Columbia; and

"(2) in the case of the District of Columbia, the
Council of the District of Columbia shall be treated
as the legislature and the Mayor of the District of
Columbia shall be treated as the Governor.".
