A BILL

To direct the Secretary of Energy to conduct a study of the effects of year-round daylight saving time on fossil fuel usage.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. STUDY.

The Secretary of Energy shall conduct a study of the effects of year-round daylight saving time on fossil fuel usage. The study shall examine the effects if the entire United States were to adopt year-round daylight saving time, and the effects on each major region of the country separately. Not later than one year after the date of the

- 1 enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall transmit to the
- 2 Congress a report of the findings of the study.
