A BILL

To amend title XVIII of the Social Security Act to apply a uniform geographic cost-of-practice index value for physicians' services furnished under the Medicare Program of 1.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE; FINDINGS.
- 4 (a) Short Title.—This Act may be cited as the
- 5 "Medicare Access Equity Act of 2002".
- 6 (b) FINDINGS.—Congress makes the following find-
- 7 ings:

- 1 (1) Americans have paid taxes in to the medi-2 care program equally across the country and every 3 American should have access to quality health care.
 - (2) There is a national market for health care providers.
 - (3) Increasingly, private insurance companies tie their reimbursement rates to those paid by medicare.
 - (4) The physician fee schedule formula for medicare currently includes several adjustments for variable costs throughout the nation. While it is appropriate for the cost of running a practice to reflect overhead differences, physicians should not be compensated for their time differently based on where they live.
 - (5) Medicare beneficiaries pay the same part B premium regardless of location which forces subsidization of higher reimbursement areas by seniors in lower reimbursement areas without any corresponding benefit.
 - (6) Areas of the country that currently receive the lowest reimbursement from medicare are often the same areas that are experiencing the greatest shortage of physicians. Attracting more physicians

1	to these areas cannot be achieved without greater
2	equity in medicare reimbursement.
3	SEC. 2. PHYSICIAN FEE SCHEDULE WAGE INDEX REVISION
4	Section 1848(e)(1)(A)(iii) of the Social Security Act
5	(42 U.S.C. 1395w-4(e)(1)(A)(iii)) is amended to read as
6	follows:
7	"(iii)(I) for services furnished before
8	2003, an index which reflects 1/4 of the dif-
9	ference between the relative value of physi-
10	cians' work effort in each of the different
11	fee schedule areas and the national average
12	of such work effort; and
13	"(II) for services furnished after
14	2002, without regard to any limitation oth-
15	erwise applicable under subsection
16	(c)(2)(B)(ii)(II), an index equal to 1 for
17	relative value of physicians' work effort in
18	all fee schedule areas.".

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
