A BILL

To provide for the liquidation or reliquidation of certain entries of certain manufacturing equipment.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. DUTY RELIQUIDATION FOR CERTAIN MANUFACTURING EQUIPMENT ENTERED ON OR
AFTER OCTOBER 21, 1998, AND BEFORE JULY

10, 1999.

(a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding sections 514 and
520 of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1514 and 1520)

or any other provision of law, not later than 90 days after

the receipt of the request described in subsection (b), any 2 article — 3 (1) that was entered, or withdrawn from ware-4 house for consumption— (A) on or after October 21, 1998; and 5 6 (B) before July 10, 1999; and 7 (2) with respect to which heading 9902.84.81, 8 9902.84.83, 9902.84.85, 9902.84.87, 9902.84.89, or 9 9902.84.91 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of 10 the United States would have applied if such article 11 had been entered, or withdrawn from warehouse for 12 consumption, on December 31, 2001, 13 shall be liquidated or reliquidated as if heading 14 9902.84.81, 9902.84.83, 9902.84.85, 9902.84.87, 15 9902.84.89, or 9902.84.91, whichever is applicable, applied to such entry or withdrawal, and the Secretary of the Treasury shall refund any excess duty paid with re-18 spect to such entry. 19 (b) Requests.—Liquidation or reliquidation may be 20 made under subsection (a) with respect to any entry only 21 if a request therefor is filed with the Customs Service, within 180 days after the date of enactment of this Act, that contains sufficient information to enable the Customs Service— 24 25 (1) to locate the entry; or
