A BILL

To authorize appropriations for fiscal year 2003 for military activities of the Department of Defense and to prescribe military personnel strengths for fiscal year 2003.

- 10 for the same purposes and the same time period as, the ac-
- 11 count to which transferred.
- 12 (b) Congressional Notice-And-Wait Require-
- 13 MENT.—A transfer may not be made under section 101(b)
- 14 or 102(b) until the Secretary of Defense has submitted a
- 15 notice in writing to the Committees on Armed Services and

4	SEC. 301. ESTABLISHMENT OF AT LEAST ONE WEAPONS OF
5	MASS DESTRUCTION CIVIL SUPPORT TEAM IN
6	EACH STATE.
7	$(a) \ Findings. — Congress \ makes \ the \ following \ findings:$
8	(1) Weapons of Mass Destruction Civil Support
9	Teams are strategic assets, stationed at the oper-
10	ational level, as an immediate response capability to
11	assist local responders in the event of an emergency
12	within the United States involving use or potential
13	use of weapons of mass destruction.
14	(2) Since September 11 2001, Civil Support
15	Teams have responded to more than 200 requests for
16	support from civil authorities for actual or potential
17	weapons of mass destruction incidents and have sup-
18	ported various national events, including the World
19	Series, the Super Bowl, and the 2002 Winter Olym-
20	pics.
21	(3) To enhance homeland security as the Nation
22	fights the war against terrorism, each State and terri-
23	tory must have a Weapons of Mass Destruction Civil
24	Support Team to respond to potential weapons of
25	mass destruction incidents.

- 1 (4) In section 1026 of the Bob Stump National 2 Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2003 as 3 passed the House of Representatives on May 10, 2002 4 (H.R. 4546 of the 107th Congress), the House of Rep-5 resentatives has already taken action to that end by 6 expressing the sense of Congress that the Secretary of 7 Defense should establish 23 additional Weapons of 8 Mass Destruction Civil Support Teams in order to 9 provide at least one such team in each State and ter-10 ritory.
- 11 (5) According to a September 2001 report of the 12 Comptroller General entitled "Combating Terrorism", 13 the Department of Defense plans that there eventually 14 should be a Weapons of Mass Destruction Civil Sup-15 port Teams in each State, territory, and the District 16 of Columbia.
- 17 (b) Requirement.—From funds authorized to be ap-18 propriated in section 101, the Secretary of Defense shall en-19 sure that there is established at least one Weapons of Mass 20 Destruction Civil Support Team in each State.
- 21 (c) Definitions.—For purposes of this section:
- 22 (1) The term "Weapons of Mass Destruction 23 Civil Support Team" means a team of members of the 24 reserve components of the armed forces that is estab-25 lished under section 12310(c) of title 10, United

- 1 States Code, in support of emergency preparedness
- 2 programs to prepare for or to respond to any emer-
- 3 gency involving the use of a weapon of mass destruc-
- 4 tion.
- 5 (2) The term "State" includes the District of Co-
- 6 lumbia, Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands, and Guam.
- 7 (d) Deadline for Implementation.—The Secretary
- 8 of Defense shall ensure that subsection (b) is fully imple-
- 9 mented not later than September 30, 2003.
- 10 SEC. 302. AUTHORITY FOR JOINT TASK FORCES TO
- 11 PROVIDE SUPPORT TO LAW ENFORCEMENT
- 12 AGENCIES CONDUCTING COUNTER-TER-
- 13 RORISM ACTIVITIES.
- 14 (a) AUTHORITY.—A joint task force of the Department
- 15 of Defense that provides support to law enforcement agen-
- 16 cies conducting counter-drug activities may also provide,
- 17 consistent with all applicable laws and regulations, support
- 18 to law enforcement agencies conducting counter-terrorism
- 19 activities.
- 20 (b) Conditions.—Any support provided under sub-
- 21 section (a) may only be provided in the geographic area
- 22 of responsibility of the joint task force.
- 23 (c) Funds are hereby authorized to be appro-
- 24 priated for fiscal year 2003 in the amount of \$5,000,000

- 1 to provide support for counter-terrorism activities in ac-
- 2 cordance with subsections (a) and (b).
- 3 SEC. 303. SENSE OF CONGRESS ON ASSISTANCE TO FIRST
- 4 **RESPONDERS**.
- 5 It is the sense of Congress that the Secretary of Defense
- 6 should, to the extent the Secretary determines appropriate,
- 7 use funds provided in this Act to assist, train, and equip
- 8 local fire and police departments that would be a first re-
- 9 sponder to a domestic terrorist incident that may come
- 10 about in connection with the continued fight to prosecute
- 11 the war on terrorism.
