## AN ACT

To authorize appropriations for fiscal year 2003 for military activities of the Department of Defense and to prescribe military personnel strengths for fiscal year 2003.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

8	and, to the extent appropriations are made pursuant to
9	such authorizations, shall only be expended in a manner

- 4 (b) Transfer Authority.—Subject to section 103,
- 5 the Secretary of Defense may, in the Secretary's discre-
- 6 tion, transfer amounts authorized in subsection (a) to any
- 7 fiscal year 2003 military personnel or operation and main-
- 8 tenance account of the Department of Defense for the pur-
- 9 poses stated in that subsection.
- 10 SEC. 102. WAR ON TERRORISM EQUIPMENT REPLACEMENT
- 11 AND ENHANCEMENT FUND.
- 12 (a) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is
- 13 hereby authorized to be appropriated to the Department
- 14 of Defense for fiscal year 2003 the amount of
- 15 \$1,000,000,000, to be available only in accordance with
- 16 the purposes stated in section 2 and to be used only as
- 17 provided in subsection (b).
- 18 (b) Transfer Authority.—Subject to section 103,
- 19 the Secretary of Defense may, in the Secretary's discre-
- 20 tion, transfer amounts authorized in subsection (a) to any
- 21 fiscal year 2003 procurement or research, development,
- 22 test, and evaluation account of the Department of Defense
- 23 for the purpose of—
- 24 (1) emergency replacement of equipment and
- 25 munitions lost or expended in operations conducted

- as part of Operation Noble Eagle or Operation En-
- 2 during Freedom; or
- 3 (2) enhancement of critical military capabilities
- 4 necessary to carry out operations pursuant to Public
- 5 Law 107-40.
- 6 SEC. 103. GENERAL PROVISIONS APPLICABLE TO TRANS-
- 7 FERS.
- 8 (a) In General.—Amounts transferred pursuant to
- 9 section 101(b) or 102(b) shall be merged with, and avail-
- 10 able for the same purposes and the same time period as,
- 11 the account to which transferred.
- 12 (b) Congressional Notice-and-Wait Require-
- 13 MENT.—A transfer may not be made under section 101(b)
- 14 or 102(b) until the Secretary of Defense has submitted
- 15 a notice in writing to the Committees on Armed Services
- 16 and the Committees on Appropriations of the Senate and
- 17 House of Representatives of the proposed transfer and a
- 18 period of 15 days has elapsed after the date such notice
- 19 is received. Any such notice shall include specification of
- 20 the amount of the proposed transfer, the account to which
- 21 the transfer is to be made, and the purpose of the transfer.

- 23 transfer authority provided by this subtitle is in addition

7	SEC. 301. ESTABLISHMENT OF AT LEAST ONE WEAPONS OF	
8	MASS DESTRUCTION CIVIL SUPPORT TEAM IN	
9	EACH STATE.	
10	(a) FINDINGS.—Congress makes the following find-	
11	ings:	
12	(1) Weapons of Mass Destruction Civil Support	
13	Teams are strategic assets, stationed at the oper-	
14	ational level, as an immediate response capability to	
15	assist local responders in the event of an emergency	
16	within the United States involving use or potential	
17	use of weapons of mass destruction.	
18	(2) Since September 11 2001, Civil Support	
19	Teams have responded to more than 200 requests	
20	for support from civil authorities for actual or poten-	
21	tial weapons of mass destruction incidents and have	
22	supported various national events, including the	
23	World Series, the Super Bowl, and the 2002 Winter	
24	Olympics.	

- 1 (3) To enhance homeland security as the Na-2 tion fights the war against terrorism, each State and 3 territory must have a Weapons of Mass Destruction 4 Civil Support Team to respond to potential weapons 5 of mass destruction incidents.
- 6 (4) In section 1026 of the Bob Stump National 7 Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2003 as 8 passed the House of Representatives on May 10, 9 2002 (H.R. 4546 of the 107th Congress), the House 10 of Representatives has already taken action to that 11 end by expressing the sense of Congress that the 12 Secretary of Defense should establish 23 additional 13 Weapons of Mass Destruction Civil Support Teams 14 in order to provide at least one such team in each 15 State and territory.
  - (5) According to a September 2001 report of the Comptroller General entitled "Combating Terrorism", the Department of Defense plans that there eventually should be a Weapons of Mass Destruction Civil Support Teams in each State, territory, and the District of Columbia.
- 22 (b) REQUIREMENT.—From funds authorized to be 23 appropriated in section 101, the Secretary of Defense shall 24 ensure that there is established at least one Weapons of 25 Mass Destruction Civil Support Team in each State.

- 1 (c) Definitions.—For purposes of this section:
- 2 (1) The term "Weapons of Mass Destruction
- 3 Civil Support Team" means a team of members of
- 4 the reserve components of the armed forces that is
- 5 established under section 12310(c) of title 10,
- 6 United States Code, in support of emergency pre-
- 7 paredness programs to prepare for or to respond to
- 8 any emergency involving the use of a weapon of
- 9 mass destruction.
- 10 (2) The term "State" includes the District of
- 11 Columbia, Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands, and
- Guam.
- 13 (d) Deadline for Implementation.—The Sec-
- 14 retary of Defense shall ensure that subsection (b) is fully
- 15 implemented not later than September 30, 2003.
- 16 SEC. 302. AUTHORITY FOR JOINT TASK FORCES TO
- 17 PROVIDE SUPPORT TO LAW ENFORCEMENT
- 18 AGENCIES CONDUCTING COUNTER-TER-
- 19 RORISM ACTIVITIES.
- 20 (a) AUTHORITY.—A joint task force of the Depart-
- 21 ment of Defense that provides support to law enforcement
- 22 agencies conducting counter-drug activities may also pro-
- 23 vide, consistent with all applicable laws and regulations,
- 24 support to law enforcement agencies conducting counter-
- 25 terrorism activities.

- 1 (b) CONDITIONS.—Any support provided under sub-
- 2 section (a) may only be provided in the geographic area
- 3 of responsibility of the joint task force.
- 4 (c) Funds are hereby authorized to be ap-
- 5 propriated for fiscal year 2003 in the amount of
- 6 \$5,000,000 to provide support for counter-terrorism ac-
- 7 tivities in accordance with subsections (a) and (b).
- 8 SEC. 303. SENSE OF CONGRESS ON ASSISTANCE TO FIRST
- 9 RESPONDERS.
- 10 It is the sense of Congress that the Secretary of De-
- 11 fense should, to the extent the Secretary determines ap-
- 12 propriate, use funds provided in this Act to assist, train,
- 13 and equip local fire and police departments that would be
- 14 a first responder to a domestic terrorist incident that may
- 15 come about in connection with the continued fight to pros-
- 16 ecute the war on terrorism.
