- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

- 3 SECTION 1. CRIMINAL PENALTIES FOR FALSE INFORMA-
- 4 TION IN REGISTRATION OF DOMAIN NAMES.
- 5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 47 of title 18, United
- 6 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-
- 7 lowing new section:

3	"(a) Offense.—Whoever knowingly and with intent
4	to defraud provides material and misleading false contact
5	information to a domain name registrar, domain name
6	registry, or other domain name registration authority in

8	or imprisoned not more than 5 years, or both.
9	"(b) Definitions.—In this section—
10	"(1) the term 'domain name' means any alpha-
11	numeric designation which is registered with or as-
12	signed by a domain name registrar, domain name
13	registry, or other domain name registration author-
14	ity as part of an electronic address on the Internet;

16	"(2) the term 'Internet' has the meaning given
17	that term in section 230(f)(1) of the Communica-
18	tions Act of 1034 (47 U.S.C. 230(f)(1)).".
19	(b) Conforming Amendment.—The table of sec-
20	tions for chapter 47 of title 18, United States Code, is
21	amended by adding at the end the following new item:
	"1037. Fraudulent information in registering domain name.".
