Mr. Berry introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce

A BILL

To require that pseudoephedrine be dispensed only upon a written prescription of a licensed practitioner, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Methamphetamine
- 5 Elimination Act of 2002".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 7 The Congress finds the following:
- 8 (1) The United States faces increasing danger
- 9 related to methamphetamine trafficking, use, and
- abuse.

- 1 (2) The number of methamphetamine-related 2 emergency room admissions has more than doubled 3 since 1991, rising from around 4,900 to over 4 10,000.
 - (3) Methamphetamine-producing clandestine laboratories have been identified by the Drug Enforcement Administration as a significant threat to the Nation's public health and safety.
 - (4) Methamphetamine production has expanded across the Nation, from California, to the Pacific Northwest, to the Midwest and Southeast. There is evidence that methamphetamine production is now spreading to the Mid-Atlantic and Northeast.
 - (5) Methamphetamine producers can easily purchase most of the ingredients necessary to manufacture methamphetamine from any retail store.
 - (6) The vast majority of methamphetamine laboratory operators obtain their precursor chemicals from domestic sources.
 - (7) Pseudoephedrine is an essential precursor chemical in the production of methamphetamine, which prompted the Drug Enforcement Administration to initiate several investigations regarding the chemical's sale and distribution.

- 1 (8) Efforts to reduce access to pseudoephedrine 2 by methamphetamine producers, such as blister 3 packaging and sales thresholds, have not been effec-4 tive deterrents, and pseudoephedrine tablets remain 5 pervasive in the illicit production of methamphet-6 amine.
- 7 SEC. 3. TREATMENT OF PSEUDOEPHEDRINE AS A PRE-
- 8 SCRIPTION DRUG.
- 9 The Secretary of Health and Human Services shall 10 treat pseudoephedrine as a drug subject to section 11 503(b)(1) of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act 12 (21 U.S.C. 353(b)(1)).
