## A BILL

To direct the Secretary of Education to make grants to States to establish antibullying programs.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-  
2       tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

**3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “School Safety and Vi-  
5       lence Prevention Act”.

**6 SEC. 2. GRANTS FOR ANTIBULLYING PROGRAMS.**

7       (a) PROGRAM AUTHORIZED.—The Secretary of Edu-  
8       cation shall make a grant to each State that submits an  
9       application in accordance with subsection (c) to enable the

1 State to establish an antibullying program described in  
2 subsection (b).

3 (b) USE OF FUNDS.—Amounts provided as a grant  
4 to a State under this section shall be used for the estab-  
5 lishment and operation of an antibullying program, which  
6 shall consist of the following:

7 (1) Antibullying educational, counseling, men-  
8 toring, and peer programs.

9 (2) A statewide database for schools to report,  
10 in real time, school-related crimes, violence, and bul-  
11 lying.

12 (3) A statewide hotline for anonymous report-  
13 ing by students and staff of information on bullying.

14 (4) An emergency response plan for responding  
15 to school-related crimes, violence, and bullying.

16 (c) APPLICATIONS.—To receive a grant under this  
17 section, a State shall submit an application to the Sec-  
18 retary at such time, in such manner, and containing such  
19 information as the Secretary may require.

20 (d) BUDGET ACT COMPLIANCE.—The Secretary may  
21 make grants under this section only to the extent or in  
22 the amounts provided in advance in appropriations Acts.

23 (e) DEFINITIONS.—For purposes of this section:

24 (1) The term “Secretary” means the Secretary  
25 of Education.
