## A BILL

To amend the National and Community Service Act of 1990 to create the Right of Passage Community Service Program.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Right of Passage Com-
- 5 munity Service Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE.
- 7 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds the following:
- 8 (1) The teenage years are a pivotal time of life,
- 9 when young people are making choices that will ef-
- fect them for the rest of their lives.

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- (2) How young people spend their time during their teenage years may set them on a course of active citizenship and engaged learning, or down a path of risky behavior with the likelihood of failure.
  - (3) Research suggests that when young people see that they are able to improve the lives of others they feel that they are able to control and improve their own lives.
  - (4) If properly trained, organized, and supervised, teenagers are a resource that can make a significant contribution to their communities.
  - (5) Opportunities for volunteer service during the teenage years could become a right of passage for future generations.
  - (6) The National Academy of Sciences Report on Youth Development concluded that "the future well-being of the country depends on raising generations of skilled, competent, and responsible adults".
  - (b) Purpose.—It is the purpose of this Act to—
    - (1) create a national network of service programs for middle school students to serve in their communities after school and during the summer;
    - (2) provide students with opportunities to serve in their communities and participate in other programs such as workshops in leadership development,

1	public speaking, conflict resolution, team-building,
2	and other character-building programs;
3	(3) provide young people an experience that re-
4	inforces their connection to the community, enriches
5	their education, and strengthens their personal and
6	civic values; and
7	(4) instill an ethic of service in young people
8	which will stay with them throughout their lives.
9	SEC. 3. RIGHT OF PASSAGE COMMUNITY SERVICE PRO-
10	GRAM.
11	(a) Establishment.—Section 122(a) of the Na-
12	tional and Community Service Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C.
13	12572(a)) is amended—
14	(1) by redesignating paragraph (15) as para-
15	graph (16); and
16	(2) by inserting after paragraph (14) the fol-
17	lowing:
18	"(15) A community-based Right of Passage
19	after school and summer service corps program that
20	offers young people—
21	"(A) the opportunity to perform service in
22	their communities;
23	"(B) the opportunity to participate in ac-
24	tivities that would provide training in leadership

1	development, public speaking, conflict resolu-
2	tion, team building, and other critical skills;
3	"(C) service-learning curricula linked to
4	academic goals; and
5	"(D) the opportunity to work with older
6	AmeriCorps members who can organize service
7	projects and act as mentors.".
8	(b) Eligibility.—Section 137 of such Act (42
9	U.S.C. 12591) is amended—
10	(1) by redesignating subsection (c) as sub-
11	section (d); and
12	(2) by inserting after subsection (b) the fol-
13	lowing:
14	"(c) Special Rules for Right of Passage Pro-
15	GRAM.—An individual shall be considered to be a partici-
16	pant in a Right of Passage community-based after school
17	or summer service corps program described in section
18	122(a)(15) (42 U.S.C. 12591) that is carried out with as-
19	sistance provided under section 121(a) (42 U.S.C. 12571)
20	if the individual—
21	"(1) satisfies the requirements of paragraphs
22	(1), (2), and (6) of subsection (a); and
23	"(2) is between the ages of 12 and 16, inclusive
24	at the time the individual begins the term of serv-
25	ice.".

1	(c) Terms of Service.—Section 139(b) of such Act
2	(42 U.S.C. 12593(b)) is amended by adding at the end
3	the following:
4	"(4) Special rule for right of passage
5	PROGRAM.—An individual participating in a Right of
6	Passage community-based after school or summer
7	service corps program described in section
8	122(a)(15) shall agree to participate in the program
9	for not less than 160 hours during a period of not
10	less than 2 months and not more than 1 year.".
11	(d) National Service Educational Award.—
12	(1) Special rule for right of passage
13	PROGRAM.—Section 141 of such Act (42 U.S.C
14	12595) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
15	lowing:
16	"(c) Special Rule for Right of Passage Pro-
17	GRAM.—An individual participating in a Right of Passage
18	community-based after school or summer service corps
19	program described in section 122(a)(15), upon completion
20	of the required 160 hours of service shall receive an edu-
21	cation award of \$500.".
22	(2) Eligible individuals.—Section 146 is
23	amended—
24	(A) in subsection (a)(2) by striking "or $\epsilon$
25	program described in section 122(a)(9):" and

1	inserting ", a program described in section
2	122(a)(9), or a program described in section
3	122(a)(15);"; and
4	(B) in subsection (d)(2)—
5	(i) in subparagraph (A), by striking
6	"or";
7	(ii) in subparagraph (B), by striking
8	"period." and inserting "period; or"; and
9	(iii) by adding at the end the fol-
10	lowing:
11	"(C) participated in a program described
12	in section 12572(a)(15).".
13	SEC. 4. REPORT.
14	Not later than 3 years after the date of enactment
15	of this Act, the Corporation shall transmit to the Congress
16	a report and evaluation of the program authorized by this
17	Aat

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
