## **AN ACT**

To amend the Temporary Emergency Wildfire Suppression Act to facilitate the ability of the Secretary of the Interior and the Secretary of Agriculture to enter into reciprocal agreements with foreign countries for the sharing of personnel to fight wildfires. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 SECTION 1. RECIPROCAL AGREEMENTS FOR SHARING PER SONNEL TO FIGHT WILDFIRES.

5 The Temporary Emergency Wildfire Suppression Act
6 (42 U.S.C. 1856m et seq.), as amended by the Wildfire
7 Suppression Assistance Act, is amended by adding at the
8 end the following new section:

9 "SEC. 5. SPECIAL TERMS FOR RECIPROCAL AGREEMENTS 10 FOR SHARING PERSONNEL TO FIGHT 11 WILDFIRES.

12 "(a) TORT LIABILITY.—In entering into a reciprocal 13 agreement with a foreign country under section 3, the Secretary of Agriculture and the Secretary of the Interior 14 15 may include as part of the agreement a provision that personnel furnished under the agreement to provide wildfire 16 presuppression or suppression services will be considered, 17 for purposes of tort liability, employees of the country re-18 ceiving such services when the personnel provide services 19 20 under the agreement.

21 "(b) ASSUMPTION OF LIABILITY; REMEDIES.—The 22 Secretary of Agriculture or the Secretary of the Interior 23 shall not enter into any agreement under section 3 con-24 taining the provision described in subsection (a) unless the 25 foreign country (either directly or through the fire organi-

zation that is a party to the agreement) agrees to assume 1 2 any and all liability for the acts or omissions of American 3 firefighters engaged in providing wildfire presuppression 4 or suppression services under the agreement in the foreign 5 country. The only remedies for acts or omissions committed while providing services under the agreement shall 6 7 be those provided under the laws of the host country, and 8 those remedies shall be the exclusive remedies for any 9 claim arising out of providing such services in a foreign 10 country.

11 "(c) PROTECTIONS.—Neither the firefighter, the 12 sending country, nor any organization associated with the 13 firefighter shall be subject to any action whatsoever pertaining to  $\mathbf{or}$ arising out of providing wildfire 14 15 presuppression or suppression services under a reciprocal 16 agreement under section 3.".
