A BILL

To provide that the marriage penalty relief provisions of the Economic Growth and Tax Relief Reconciliation Act of 2001 shall be permanent whenever the actual on-budget budget of the Government is in balance or surplus and the Director of the Office of Management and Budget determines that this Act will not cause on-budget deficits.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Permanent Marriage
5 Penalty Tax Relief Act of 2002”.

1 **SEC. 2. MARRIAGE PENALTY RELIEF PROVISIONS MADE**2 **PERMANENT.**

3 Title IX of the Economic Growth and Tax Relief Rec-
4 onciliation Act of 2001 (relating to sunset of provisions
5 of Act) shall not apply to title III of such Act (relating
6 to marriage penalty relief).

7 **SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

8 Section 2 shall not take effect unless and until the
9 Director of the Office of Management and Budget—

10 (1) determines that—

11 (A) the on-budget budget of the Govern-
12 ment has been in balance or surplus for at least
13 one fiscal year ending after the date of enact-
14 ment of this Act; and

15 (B) if such section were to take effect, it
16 would not produce an on-budget deficit in the
17 fiscal year in which it takes effect, based on the
18 most recent economic and technical assump-
19 tions by the Director; and

20 (2) causes such determination to be published
21 in the Federal Register.
