- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Nondiscrimination in
- 5 Employee Benefits Act of 2001".

1 SEC. 2. NONDISCRIMINATION IN EMPLOYEE BENEFITS.

- 2 Section 510 of the Employee Retirement Income Se-
- 3 curity Act of 1974 is amended by inserting before the last
- 4 sentence the following: "In a case in which an employer
- 5 elects to offer benefits to associates of its employees who
- 6 are not spouses or dependents of the employees, the em-
- 7 ployer shall offer such benefits on a non discriminatory
- 8 basis without regard to the nature of the relationship be-
- 9 tween the employee and the designated associate.".
