10	(b) Effective Date.—The amendments made by
11	subsection (a) shall apply to payments under sections
12	1174a and 1175 of title 10, United States Code, and pay-
13	ments of disability compensation under laws administered
14	by the Department of Veterans Affairs that are made after
15	the date of the enactment of this Act.
