### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Peace Corps Expan-
- 5 sion Act of 2002".

### 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

7 Congress makes the following findings:

(1) In his State of the Union address on Janu-
ary 29, 2002, President George W. Bush called for
doubling the number of Peace Corps volunteers to
14,000 by the end of fiscal year 2007.
(2) The Peace Corps currently is operating in
70 countries with 7,000 Peace Corps volunteers and
an annual budget of approximately \$275,000,000.
(3) Section 2(b) of the Peace Corps Act states
that "it is the policy of the United States and a pur-
pose of the Peace Corps to maintain a volun-
teer corps of at least 10,000 individuals", and in
1999 legislation was enacted authorizing the appro-
priation of funds sufficient to achieve this goal by
the end of fiscal year 2003.
(4) The Peace Corps was established in 1961 to
promote world peace and friendship through the
service of American volunteers abroad.
(5) Since its establishment, the Peace Corps
has an anatal in 195 countries with a total of an

rps has operated in 135 countries with a total of ap-proximately 165,000 Peace Corps volunteers.

(6) After more than 40 years of operation, the Peace Corps remains the world's premier inter-national service organization dedicated to promoting grassroots development.

(7) The Peace Corps remains committed to
 sending well-trained and well-supported volunteers
 overseas to promote peace, friendship, and grass roots development.

### 5 SEC. 3. DECLARATION OF POLICY.

9 SEC. 4. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS FOR FISCAL
10 YEARS 2003 THROUGH 2007 TO CARRY OUT
11 THE PEACE CORPS ACT.

12 Section 3(b)(1) of the Peace Corps Act (22 U.S.C. 2502(b)(1)) is amended to striking "and \$365,000,000 13 fiscal year 2003" and inserting "\$320,000,000 for fiscal 14 fiscal 15 year 2003,\$362,000,000 for year 2004,\$404,000,000 for fiscal year 2005, \$446,000,000 for fis-16 cal year 2006, and \$488,000,000 for fiscal year 2007". 17
