3 (a) PROHIBITION.—No permit may be issued or ap4 proved under any provision of the Clean Air Act after the
5 date of the enactment of this Act for any new source de6 scribed in subsection (b).

7 (b) NEW SOURCE.—For purposes of this section, the8 term "new source" means any source—

9 (1) that, for purposes of any emission standard,
10 is a new source (as defined in regulations under the
11 Clean Air Act);

12 (2) that is located in any State that borders13 any of the Great Lakes; and

14 (3) whose emissions would result in the deposi-15 tion of mercury into the Great Lakes System.
