## A BILL

To encourage respect for the rights of religious and ethnic minorities in Iran and to deter Iran from supporting international terrorism and from furthering its weapons of mass destruction programs.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. IMMEDIATELY ENDING THE UNITED STATES
- 4 IMPORTATION OF IRANIAN GOODS.
- 5 Notwithstanding any other provision of law and ex-
- 6 cept as provided in section 2, no textile or food article that

1	is produced, grown, or manufactured in Iran shall enter
2	or be imported into the United States.
3	SEC. 2. CONDITIONS FOR THE RESUMPTION OF UNITED
4	STATES IMPORTATION OF IRANIAN GOODS.
5	The President may waive the prohibition on the im-
6	portation of Iranian goods to the United States 10 days
7	after submitting a certification to the Committee on For-
8	eign Relations of the Senate and the Committee on Inter-
9	national Relations of the House of Representatives stating
10	that—
11	(1) Iran has shown substantial progress in re-
12	specting the rights of ethnic and religious minorities
13	and is meeting internationally recognized human
14	rights standards including due process under law;
15	(2) Iran has ceased its support for international
16	terrorism; and
17	(3) Iran has terminated its weapons of mass
18	destruction programs.
