A BILL

To name the Department of Veterans Affairs in Houston, Texas, as the "Michael E. DeBakey Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Center".

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. FINDINGS.
- 4 Congress finds as follows:
- 5 (1) Dr. DeBakey played a critical role in estab-
- 6 lishing and developing the Department of Veterans
- 7 Affairs Medical Center in Houston, Texas. He has
- 8 successfully elevated its professional staff and qual-

- ity healthcare to meet high standards of excellence and encouraged minorities to fulfill their potential in education, and particularly in the health professions.
 - (2) Dr. DeBakey's dedication to the Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Center is ongoing. He is still chairman of the Dean's Committee of the Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Center, as he has been since the beginning of the institution.
 - (3) Dr. DeBakey brought both the City of Houston and the State of Texas international recognition for the Texas Medical Center through his pioneering of medical research, his leadership at Baylor College of Medicine, his national and international medical statesmanship, and his championing of the rights and the welfare of the underprivileged.
 - (4) Dr. DeBakey is credited with the development of the Mobile Army Surgical Hospitals (MASH) concepts for the military, which has led to saving thousands of lives during the Korean and Vietnam conflicts, as well as the development of specialized medical and surgical center systems in order to treat returning military personnel.
 - (5) During World War II, he served as Colonel in the United States Army assigned to the Surgical

- 2 General. His active duty service ran from 1942 to
- 3 1946. He remained on active duty in 1946 and re-
- 4 cruited 100 additional specialists to care for World
- 5 War II wounded military personnel in U.S. Army
- 6 specialty centers.
- 7 (6) For his service in the armed forces, Dr.
- 8 DeBakey received the Legion of Merit.

- 11 (a) The Department of Veterans Affairs medical cen-
- 12 ter in Houston, Texas, shall after the date of the enact-
- 13 ment of this Act be known and designated as the "Michael
- 14 E. DeBakey Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Cen-
- 15 ter".
- 16 SEC. 3. REFERENCES.
- 17 Any reference in any law, regulation, map, document,
- 18 record, or other paper of the United States to the medical
- 19 center referred to in section 1 shall be considered to be
- 20 a reference to the Michael E. DeBakey Department of
- 21 Veterans Affairs Medical Center.
