A BILL

- To provide grants to State educational agencies and local educational agencies for the provision of classroom-related technology training for elementary and secondary school teachers.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Teacher Technology
 - 5 Training Act".
 - 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 7 Congress makes the following findings:

- 1 (1) Between 1994 and 2005, more than 2 1,000,000 new computer scientists and engineers, 3 system analysts, and computer programmers will be 4 required in the United States.
 - (2) Today's elementary school and secondary school students need effective computer training in schools so that the students can effectively compete in tomorrow's job market.
 - (3) More schools are using computers than ever before creating a greater need for teachers to utilize computer equipment effectively in a classroom setting.
 - (4) In just 3 years, the percentage of public schools with Internet access increased from 35 percent in the fall of 1994 to 78 percent in the fall of 1997, with 98 percent of all schools owning computers.
 - (5) The need for teachers who have knowledge and mastery of computer skills in the classroom is great.
 - (6) Schools need increased funding to serve the computer and technology needs of their rapidly growing student populations.
 - (7) Only 23 percent of elementary school and secondary school teachers feel qualified in using

- 1 computers and related technology, according to the
- 2 Department of Education.

3 SEC. 3 DEFINITIONS.

- 4 The terms used in this Act have the meanings given
- 5 the terms in section 14101 of the Elementary and Sec-
- 6 ondary Education Act of 1965.

7 SEC. 4. PROGRAM AUTHORIZED.

- 8 (a) In General.—The Secretary is authorized to
- 9 award grants to State educational agencies to enable the
- 10 State educational agencies to award grants to local edu-
- 11 cational agencies for the provision of classroom-related
- 12 technology training for licensed or certified elementary
- 13 school or secondary school teachers.
- 14 (b) NEED BASIS.—Each State educational agency
- 15 that receives a grant under this Act shall use the grant
- 16 funds to award grants to local educational agencies in the
- 17 State on the basis of the local educational agencies' dem-
- 18 onstrated need for strengthening teacher training in the
- 19 use of technology in instruction.
- 20 (c) Duration.—A grant made under this Act shall
- 21 be awarded for a period not to exceed 5 years.
- 22 SEC. 5. GRANT AWARD.
- 23 (a) APPLICATIONS.—To be eligible to receive a grant
- 24 under this Act—

- 1 (1) a State educational agency shall submit an 2 application to the Secretary at such time and in 3 such form as the Secretary may require; and
- 4 (2) a local educational agency shall submit an 5 application to the State educational agency at such 6 time and in such form as the State educational 7 agency may require.
- 8 (b) Number.—A State educational agency shall 9 award not less than one grant under this Act to a local 10 educational agency in the State that meets the criteria for 11 the grant award that are established by the Secretary. If 12 the amount appropriated under section 8 for a fiscal year 13 is \$50,000,000 or greater, the Secretary shall award one 14 grant to each State educational agency that applies and 15 serves one of the 50 States of the United States.

16 SEC. 6. USES OF FUNDS.

A local educational agency that receives a grant under this Act may use the grant funds to strengthen instruction and learning, provide professional development, and pay the costs of training, related to the use of technologies in instruction. A local educational agency that receives a grant under this Act may use the grant funds to provide training by local educational agency personnel on school premises.

1 SEC. 7. EVALUATION.

- 2 (a) In General.—Not later than 3 years after the
- 3 Secretary first awards grants under this Act, the Sec-
- 4 retary shall evaluate the technology training programs for
- 5 teachers developed by local educational agencies under this
- 6 Act.
- 7 (b) Dissemination of Results.—The Secretary
- 8 shall collect information related to the evaluation and
- 9 make available to the public upon request the results of
- 10 the evaluation.
- 11 (c) Administrative Costs.—The Secretary may
- 12 use not more than 2 percent of the total amount appro-
- 13 priated under section 8 for fiscal year 2000 to conduct
- 14 the evaluation under subsection (a).

15 SEC. 8. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

- There are authorized to be appropriated to carry out
- 17 this Act \$100,000,000 for each of the fiscal years 2002,
- 18 2003, 2004, 2005, and 2006.
