RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 664) to amend title II of the Social Security Act to provide that the reductions in Social Security benefits which are required in the case of spouses and surviving spouses who are also receiving certain Government pensions shall be equal to the amount by which the total amount of the combined monthly benefit (before reduction) and monthly pension exceeds \$1,200.

- 1 Resolved, That immediately upon the adoption of this
- 2 resolution the House shall without intervention of any
- 3 point of order consider in the House the bill (H.R. 664)
- 4 to amend title II of the Social Security Act to provide that

the reductions in Social Security benefits which are re-2 quired in the case of spouses and surviving spouses who 3 are also receiving certain Government pensions shall be 4 equal to the amount by which the total amount of the combined monthly benefit (before reduction) and monthly pension exceeds \$1,200. The first reading of the bill shall be 6 dispensed with. After general debate, which shall be con-8 fined to the bill and shall not exceed 2 hours, to be equally divided and controlled by the chairman and ranking mi-10 nority member of the Committee on Ways and Means, the bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-12 minute rule. No amendment shall be in order except an amendment by and if offered by Mr. Jefferson of Louisiana, or his designee, and shall be debatable for not to 14 15 exceed one hour, equally divided and controlled by the proponent and a Member opposed thereto. Such amendment 16 17 shall not be subject to an amendment and shall not be 18 subject to a division of the question in the House or in 19 the Committee of the Whole. At the conclusion of consider-20 ation of the bill for amendment, the Committee shall rise 21 and report the bill to the House with such amendments 22 as may have been adopted. The previous question shall be considered as ordered on the bill and amendments

- 1 thereto to final passage without intervening motion, except
- 2 one motion to recommit with or without instructions.
