- Congratulating the Russian Federation and the citizens of Volgograd on the 60th anniversary of the Russian victory at Stalingrad.
- Whereas February 2, 2003, is the 60th anniversary of the Russian victory of the Battle of Stalingrad;
- Whereas, from August of 1942 to February of 1943, Russia fought valiantly against overwhelming odds and halted the southern advance of a Nazi Germany force exceeding 500,000 soldiers and turned the tide of World War II;
- Whereas 16 Russian divisions under the command of General Vasily I. Chuikov, defended the city of Stalingrad at the highest of costs and effectively launched an offensive that would carry them to Berlin and conclusively to the end of the war;

- Whereas, despite the efforts of Axis forces to crush the Russian state, the Russian people never lost their hope for victory or belief in the cause of the Allied forces;
- Whereas Russia provided necessary inspiration and encouragement for Allied forces fighting throughout Africa, Europe, and the Pacific; and
- Whereas Russia sacrificed over 1,000,000 lives and endured the most tremendous of hardships to withstand the Nazi assault: Now, therefore, be it
