To require that the area of a zip code number shall be located entirely within a State, and for other purposes.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. AREAS WITH A ZIP CODE NUMBER WITHIN A
4	SINGLE STATE.
5	(a) Definitions.—In this section, the term—
6	(1) "State" means each State of the United
7	States, the District of Columbia, and each posses-
8	sion of the United States; and
9	(2) "zip code" means the system used under
10	the Postal Service zoning improvement plan.

(b) ZIP CODES WITHIN A STATE.—

- (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 120 days after the date of enactment of this Act, the United States Postal Service shall take such actions as necessary (including the assignment or reassignment of any zip code number) to ensure that the geographic area to which any zip code number is assigned or reassigned is located entirely within 1 State.
- (2) APPLICATION.—Paragraph (1) applies to zip code numbers assigned or reassigned before, on, or after the date of enactment of this Act.
- 12 (c) Report.—Not later than 130 days after the date 13 of enactment of this Act, the Postmaster General shall 14 submit a report to Congress detailing compliance with this 15 section.
