## A BILL

To facilitate the voluntary provision of emergency services during commercial air flights.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Volunteers for Safe
- 5 Skies Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. VOLUNTARY PROVISION OF EMERGENCY SERVICES
- 7 DURING COMMERCIAL AIR FLIGHTS.
- 8 (a) Program.—The Administrator of the Federal
- 9 Aviation Administration shall carry out a program to per-
- 10 mit qualified law enforcement officers, firefighters, and

- 1 emergency medical technicians to provide emergency serv-
- 2 ices on commercial air flights during emergencies.
- 3 (b) REQUIREMENTS.—The Administrator shall estab-
- 4 lish such requirements for administration of the program,
- 5 including qualifications for law enforcement officers, fire-
- 6 fighters, and emergency medical technicians, as the Ad-
- 7 ministrator considers appropriate.
- 8 (c) Confidentiality of Registry.—If as part of
- 9 the program under subsection (a) the Administrator re-
- 10 quires or permits registration of law enforcement officers,
- 11 firefighters, or emergency medical technicians who are
- 12 willing to provide emergency services on commercial
- 13 flights during emergencies, the Administrator shall take
- 14 appropriate actions to ensure that the registry is available
- 15 only to appropriate airline personnel and otherwise re-
- 16 mains confidential.
- 17 (d) Consultation.—The Administrator shall con-
- 18 sult with appropriate representatives of the commercial
- 19 airline industry, and organizations representing commu-
- 20 nity-based law enforcement, firefighters, and emergency
- 21 medical technicians, in carrying out the program under
- 22 subsection (a), including the actions taken under sub-
- 23 section (c).
