Mr. CORZINE (for himself, Mr. REED, and Mr. TORRICELLI) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions

## A BILL

To increase the preparedness of the United States to respond to a biological or chemical weapons attack.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Biological and Chem-
- 5 ical Attack Preparedness Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. STATE PUBLIC HEALTH DISASTER PLANS.
- 7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 120 days after the
- 8 publication of the standards developed by the Secretary
- 9 of Health and Human Services (in this Act referred to
- 10 as the "Secretary") under subsection (c), each State shall

- develop a State public health disaster plan for responding 2 to biological or chemical attacks. Not later than 180 days 3 after the publication of such standards, each State shall 4 fully implement the State's plan. 5 (b) REQUIREMENTS OF PLAN.—A State public health disaster plan developed under subsection (a) shall— 6 7 (1) comply with the standards developed under 8 subsection (c); 9 (2) require designated hospitals and health care 10 providers in the State to have procedures in place to 11 provide health care items and services (including 12 antidotes, vaccines or other drugs or biologicals) to 13 all State residents in the event of a biological or 14 chemical attack; 15 (3) require that hospitals and health care pro-16 viders designated under paragraph (2) conduct 17 drills, on a semiannual or other basis determined ap-18 propriate by the Secretary, to ensure the readiness 19 of such hospital or provider to receive and treat vic-
- (4) be developed in consultation with affected
   local governments and hospitals; and

- 1 (c) STANDARDS.—Not later than 120 days after the
- 2 date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Health and
- 3 Human Services shall develop, and publish in the Federal
- 4 Register, standards relating to State public health disaster
- 5 plans, including requirements relating to the equipment,
- 6 training, treatment, and personnel that a hospital or
- 7 health care provider must have to be a designated hospital
- 8 or provider under such plan.
- 9 (d) Submission to Secretary.—
- 10 (1) In General.—Not later 360 days after the
- date on which standards are published under sub-
- section (c), and annually (or at such other regular
- periods as the Secretary may determine appropriate)
- thereafter, a State shall submit to the Secretary for
- approval the disaster plan developed by the State
- under this section. The Secretary may only approve
- such plan if the Secretary determines that the plan

- 19 (2) MONITORING.—The Secretary shall monitor
- the States to determine whether each State has de-
- veloped and implemented a State disaster plan in ac-
- cordance with this section.

16	SEC. 3. GRANTS FOR TRAINING, EQUIPMENT, AND PER-

18	(a) In General.—The Secretary, acting through the
19	Director of the Office of Emergency Preparedness, shall
20	award grants to hospitals and health care providers to en-
21	able such hospitals and providers to provide training, give
22	treatment, purchase equipment, and employ personnel.
23	(b) Eligibility.—
24	(1) In general.—To be eligible for a grant

- vider shall in consultation with the State, prepare and submit to the Director of the Office of Emergency Preparedness, an application at such time, in such manner, and containing such information as the Director may require.
  - (2) Preference for designated hospitals and Providers.—In awarding grants under this section, the Director shall give priority to applicant hospitals and health care providers that are designated hospitals or providers under the State public health disaster plan under section 2.
  - (3) GOVERNMENTAL ENTITIES.—Notwithstanding paragraph (1)(A), the Director may award a grant under this section to a State or local governmental entity if the Secretary determines that such an award is appropriate.

### (c) Use of Funds.—

(1) In General.—A grantee shall use amounts received under a grant under this section to provide training, give treatment (including the provision of antidotes, vaccines or other drugs or biologicals), purchase equipment, and employ personnel as determined to be appropriate by the Director of the Office of Emergency Preparedness to enable the grant-

- ee to carry out its duties under the State public
  health disaster plan.
- 3 (2) TECHNICAL EXPERTISE.—A grantee may
  4 use amounts received under a grant under this sec5 tion to acquire technical expertise to enable the
  6 grantee to develop appropriate responses to biologi7 cal or chemical attacks.
- 8 (d) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is 9 authorized to be appropriated, such sums as may be nec-10 essary to carry out this section.
