- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Metacomet-Monad-
- 5 nock-Mattabesett Trail Study Act of 2001".

1	SEC. 2. METACOMET-MONADNOCK-MATTABESETT TRAIL
2	FEASIBILITY STUDY.
3	Section 5(c) of the National Trails System Act (16
4	U.S.C. 1244(c)) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
5	lowing:
6	"(41) METACOMET-MONADNOCK-MATTABESETT
7	Trail.—
8	"(A) IN GENERAL.—The Metacomet-Monad-
9	nock-Mattabesett Trail, a system of trails and poten-
10	tial trails extending southward approximately 180
11	miles from the Metacomet-Monadnock Trail in west-
12	ern Massachusetts, across central Connecticut on the
13	Metacomet Trail and the Mattabesett Trail, and
14	ending at Long Island Sound in the State of Con-
15	necticut.
16	"(B) DEADLINE FOR STUDY.—Not later than 2
17	years after the date of enactment of this paragraph,
18	the Secretary of the Interior shall submit to Con-
19	gress the study required under subparagraph (A).".
