3 **SECTION 1. REPEAL OF CERTAIN TRADE SANCTIONS AND**
4 **TRAVEL PROVISIONS.**

5 (a) REPEALS.—Sections 908 and 910 of the Trade
6 Sanctions Reform and Export Enhancement Act of 2000
7 (as enacted by section 1(a) of Public Law 106–387) are
8 hereby repealed.

1 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—Section 906(a)(1)
2 of the Trade Sanctions Reform and Export Enhancement
3 Act of 2000 (as enacted by section 1(a) of Public Law
4 106–387) is amended by striking “to Cuba or”.
