- 9 (b) Conforming Amendment.—Section 302 of the
- 10 Bankruptcy, Judges, United States Trustees, and Family

- 1 Farmer Bankruptcy Act of 1986 (28 U.S.C. 581 note) is
- 2 amended by striking subsection (f).
- 3 SEC. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.

- 5 be deemed to have taken effect on July 1, 2000.
