A BILL

To amend the Public Health Service Act to establish scholarship and loan repayment programs regarding the provision of veterinary services in veterinarian shortage areas.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Veterinary Health En-
- 5 hancement Act".

1	SEC. 2. ESTABLISHMENT OF SCHOLARSHIP AND LOAN RE-
2	PAYMENT PROGRAMS REGARDING VETERI-
3	NARY MEDICINE.
4	Subpart III of part D of title III of the Public Health
5	Service Act (42 U.S.C. 254l et seq.) is amended by adding
6	at the end the following section:
7	"SEC. 338M. SCHOLARSHIP AND LOAN REPAYMENT PRO-
8	GRAMS REGARDING VETERINARY MEDICINE.
9	"(a) Scholarship Program.—The Secretary, act-
10	ing through the Administrator of the Health Resources
11	and Services Administration, shall establish a program of
12	entering into agreements with students under which the
13	Federal Government provides to the students scholarships
14	for attending schools of veterinary medicine in consider-
15	ation of the students agreeing to provide, for a period of
16	time specified in the agreement, veterinary services in vet-
17	erinarian shortage areas.
18	"(b) Loan Repayment Program.—The Secretary,
19	acting through the Administrator of the Health Resources
20	and Services Administration, shall carry out a program
21	of entering into agreements with veterinarians under
22	which the veterinarians agree to provide, for a period of
23	time specified in the agreement, veterinary services in vet-
24	erinarian shortage areas in consideration of the Federal
25	Government agreeing to repay, for each year of such serv-

1	ice, not more than \$35,000 of the principal and interest
2	of the educational loans of the veterinarians.
3	"(c) Veterinarian Shortage Areas.—
4	"(1) In general.—For purposes of this sec-
5	tion, the term 'veterinarian shortage area' means
6	any of the following:
7	"(A) An area in an urban or rural area
8	(which need not conform to the geographic
9	boundaries of a political subdivision and which
10	is a rational area for the delivery of veterinary
11	services) that the Secretary determines has a
12	shortage of veterinarians.
13	"(B) A population group that the Sec-
14	retary determines has such a shortage.
15	"(C) A public or nonprofit private medical
16	facility or other public facility that the Sec-
17	retary determines has such a shortage.
18	"(2) State participation.—In designating a
19	veterinarian shortage area in a State, the Secretary
20	shall consult with the chief veterinary-medicine offi-
21	cial of the State and with other appropriate entities
22	in the State, including representatives of schools of
23	veterinary medicine in the State; representatives of

State members of professional associations regarding

veterinary medicine; and representatives of large-ani mal veterinarians in the State.

"(d) ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUALS.—

- "(1) In GENERAL.—The Secretary may approve an individual for participation in the program under subsection (a) or (b) only if (in addition to the requirements that apply under subsection (e)) the individual has been approved by the chief veterinary-medicine official of the State involved, after such official consulted with appropriate entities in the State regarding such approval, including representatives specified in subsection (c)(2).
- "(2) STATE INVOLVED.—For purposes of paragraph (1), the State involved with respect to an individual is the State described in subparagraph (A) or (B) (as applicable), as follows:
 - "(A) In the case of the program under subsection (a), the State in which the individual attends or will attend a school of veterinary medicine with a scholarship under the program.
 - "(B) In the case of the program under subsection (b), the State that contains the veterinarian shortage area for which the individual will provide veterinary services under the program.

- 1 "(e) Applicability of Certain Provisions.—
- 2 "(1) Scholarship Program.—With respect to
- 3 the National Health Service Corps Scholarship Pro-
- 4 gram established in section 338A, the provisions of
- 5 this subpart that apply to such program shall, ex-
- 6 cept as determined by the Secretary to be incon-
- 7 sistent with subsection (a), apply to the program es-
- 8 tablished in subsection (a) in the same manner and
- 9 to the same extent as such provisions apply to the
- 10 National Health Service Corps Scholarship Program.
- 11 "(2) Loan repayment program.—With re-
- spect to the National Health Service Corps Loan
- Repayment Program established in section 338B,
- the provisions of this subpart that apply to such pro-
- gram shall, except as determined by the Secretary to
- be inconsistent with subsection (b), apply to the pro-
- gram established in subsection (b) in the same man-
- ner and to the same extent as such provisions apply
- to the National Health Service Corps Loan Repay-
- 20 ment Program.
- 21 "(f) Definition.—For purposes of this section, the
- 22 term 'school of veterinary medicine' has the meaning given
- 23 such term in section 799B.
- 24 "(g) Authorization of Appropriations.—

"(1) Scholarship program.—For the purpose of carrying out this section with respect to the program under subsection (a), there are authorized to be appropriated up to \$5,000,000 for each of the fiscal years 2002 through 2006.

"(2) Loan repayment program.—For the purpose of carrying out this section with respect to the program under subsection (b), there are authorized to be appropriated up to \$5,000,000 for each of this fiscal years 2002 through 2006.".
