Mr. NELSON of Florida introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To require that the Attorney General conduct a study regarding the ability of the Federal Bureau of Investigation to prevent and combat international crimes involving children, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “International Child
5 Safety Improvement Act of 2002”.

6 **SEC. 2. STUDY AND REPORT.**

7 (a) STUDY.—

1 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Attorney General, in
2 consultation with the Secretary of State, shall con-
3 duct a study regarding the ability of the Federal Bu-
4 reau of Investigation to prevent and combat inter-
5 national crimes involving children.

6 (2) CONTENTS.—The study conducted under
7 paragraph (1) shall—

8 (A) examine the way in which the Federal
9 Bureau of Investigation works with other Fed-
10 eral, State, and local law enforcement agencies
11 in conducting international criminal investiga-
12 tions involving children; and

13 (B) include a review of the current re-
14 sources allocated to those investigations and an
15 assessment of what resources may be needed to
16 improve the ability of the Federal Bureau of In-
17 vestigation to investigate and prevent those
18 crimes.

19 (b) REPORT.—

20 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 6 months
21 after the date of enactment of this Act, the Attorney
22 General shall submit to Congress a report on the
23 study conducted under subsection (a).

24 (2) CONTENTS.—The report submitted in ac-
25 cordance with paragraph (1) shall include—

1 (A) recommendations on steps that may be
2 taken to improve the ability of the Federal Bu-
3 reau of Investigation to investigate and prevent
4 international crimes involving children; and

5 (B) recommendations for improving the
6 ability of the Federal Bureau of Investigation
7 to coordinate with Federal, State, and local law
8 enforcement agencies when investigating those
9 crimes.

10 **SEC. 3. SHARING OF INFORMATION.**

11 When investigating international crimes involving
12 children, the Federal Bureau of Investigation shall coordi-
13 nate and share information regarding an investigation
14 with the International Criminal Police Organization
15 (Interpol).

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
