## A BILL

To direct the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a study of the former Eagledale Ferry Dock in the State of Washington for potential inclusion in the National Park System.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

### 3   **SECTION 1. FINDINGS.**

4       Congress finds that—

1           (1) on February 19, 1942, President Franklin  
2           Delano Roosevelt signed Executive Order No. 9066,  
3           which set in motion the forced exile of more than  
4           110,000 Japanese Americans;

5           (2) in the State of Washington, 12,892 Japa-  
6           nese American men, women, and children were in-  
7           carcerated for 3 years, an incarceration that violated  
8           the most basic freedoms of citizens of the United  
9           States;

10          (3) on March 30, 1942, 227 Bainbridge Island  
11          residents were the first Japanese Americans in the  
12          history of the United States to be forcibly removed  
13          from their homes by the United States Army and  
14          sent to internment camps;

15          (4) those residents began the journey to the in-  
16          terment camps when they boarded the ferry  
17          Kehloken from the former Eagledale Ferry Dock, lo-  
18          cated at the end of Taylor Avenue in Bainbridge Is-  
19          land, Washington;

20          (5) the city of Bainbridge Island has adopted a  
21          resolution stating that the site of the former  
22          Eagledale Ferry Dock should be a national memo-  
23          rial;

24          (6) similar resolutions have been introduced in  
25          the legislature in the State of Washington;

1           (7)(A) while the camps at the Minidoka Na-  
2           tional Monument and Manzanar National Historic  
3           Site tell the story of a time in the history of the  
4           United States when constitutional rights were ig-  
5           nored, the camps were placed by design in very re-  
6           mote places that are not easily accessible to visitors;  
7           and

8           (B) the site at Bainbridge Island, a short ferry  
9           ride from Seattle, Washington, would be accessible  
10          to more people;

11          (8) Bainbridge Island provides a unique oppor-  
12          tunity to create a site that will—

13                (A) honor the Japanese Americans who  
14                suffered during the internment;

15                (B) cherish their friends and community  
16                who stood beside them and welcomed them  
17                home; and

18                (C) inspire all persons to stand firm in the  
19                event the United States succumbs to similar  
20                fears again;

21          (9) the site at Bainbridge Island should be rec-  
22          ognized by the National Park Service based on—

23                (A) the national significance of the site;

24                (B) the association of the site with signifi-  
25                cant events; and

1 (C) the integrity of the location and setting  
 2 of the site; and

3 (10) the site at Bainbridge Island is critical as  
 4 an anchor for future efforts to identify, interpret,  
 5 serve, and ultimately honor the influence of Japa-  
 6 nese Americans on Bainbridge Island.

7 **SEC. 2. STUDY AND REPORT.**

8 (a) STUDY.—The Secretary of the Interior (referred  
 9 to in this Act as the “Secretary”) shall conduct a study  
 10 of the site commonly known as the “Eagledale Ferry  
 11 Dock” at Taylor Avenue in Bainbridge Island, Wash-  
 12 ington, and the historical events associated with the site,  
 13 to evaluate—

14 (1) the national significance of the site; and

15 (2) the suitability and feasibility of designating  
 16 the site as a unit of the National Park System.

17 (b) CRITERIA.—In conducting the study under sub-  
 18 section (a), the Secretary shall use the criteria for the  
 19 study of areas for potential inclusion in the National Park  
 20 System under section 8 of Public Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C.  
 21 1a–5).

22 (c) REPORT.—Not later than ~~1 year~~ *3 years* after the  
 23 date on which funds are made available for the study  
 24 under subsection (a), the Secretary shall submit to the  
 25 Committee on Resources of the House of Representatives

1 and the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources of  
2 the Senate a report that describes—

3           (1) the findings of the study; and

4           (2) any conclusions and recommendations of the  
5       Secretary.

6       (d) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There  
7 are authorized to be appropriated such sums as are nec-  
8 essary to carry out this Act.
