Mr. EDWARDS (for himself and Mr. BINGAMAN) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions

A BILL

To amend title III of the Public Health Service Act to increase professional and public awareness of the link between periodontal disease in pregnant women and preterm, low-birth weight babies and the maternal transmission of caries.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Perinatal Dental
- 5 Health Improvement Act of 2002".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 7 Congress makes the following findings:

- (1) Emerging evidence may link severe periodontal disease in pregnant women to a sevenfold increase in the risk of delivering pre-term low birth weight babies.
 - (2) The National Institutes of Health reports that "as many as 18 percent of the 250,000 premature low-weight infants born in the United States each year may be attributable to infectious oral disease.".
 - (3) Recent scientific studies suggest that the severe consequences of premature delivery and associated low birth weight may be partially preventable through improved oral health of pregnant women.
 - (4) Additionally, extensive laboratory, clinical and epidemiologic studies show that a mother's experience with tooth decay determines their young children's risk of developing cavities.
 - (5) Dental caries (tooth decay) is now understood to be an infectious and transmissible disease acquired by children primarily from their mothers.

5	Part B of title III of the Public Health Service Act
6	(42 U.S.C. 243 et seq.) is amended by inserting after sec-
7	tion 317M the following:
8	"SEC. 317M-1. GRANTS TO CONDUCT RESEARCH AND DEM
9	ONSTRATION PROJECTS THAT APPLY NEW
10	SCIENTIFIC EVIDENCE ABOUT MATERNAL
11	AND CHILD ORAL HEALTH LINKAGES.
12	"(a) Authority To Award Grants.—The Sec-
13	retary, acting through the Director of the Maternal and
14	Child Health Bureau, shall award grants to nonprofit or-
15	ganizations and accredited dental education and research
16	institutions to conduct research and demonstration
17	projects that apply new scientific evidence about maternal
18	and child oral health linkages related to adverse pregnancy
19	outcomes and maternal transmission of dental caries.
20	"(b) Requirement for Nonprofit Organiza-
21	TIONS AND ACCREDITED DENTAL EDUCATION AND RE-
22	SEARCH INSTITUTIONS.—In order to be eligible for a
23	grant under this section, a nonprofit organization or ac-
24	credited dental education and research institution shall
25	provide the Secretary with an assurance that it is a non-

1 profit organization or an accredited dental education and 2 research institution.

"(c) Use of Funds.—

- "(1) IN GENERAL.—Funds provided under this section may be used to provide direct funding to support projects in the following areas:
 - "(A) Professional Education.—
 Projects that are designed to develop programs based on the most recent research available as of the date of the conduct of the project with respect to maternal and child health to inform dentists, pediatricians, family physicians, obstetricians, nurse practitioners, and other primary care providers so they can educate women of childbearing age on the possible maternal-child health consequences of poor oral health.
 - "(B) Public Education.—Projects that are designed to develop programs based on the most recent research available as of the date of the conduct of the project with respect to maternal and child health to raise the public's awareness on possible maternal and child health consequences of poor oral health and improve the oral health practices of women of child-bearing age.

1	"(2) Limitation.—Funds provided under a
2	grant awarded under this section may not be used
3	for payment of direct dental, medical, or other serv-
4	ices or to obtain Federal matching funds under any
5	Federal program.

- 6 "(d) Application.—A nonprofit organization or an
- 7 accredited dental education and research institution desir-
- 8 ing a grant under this section shall submit an application
- 9 to the Secretary in such form and manner and containing
- 10 such information as the Secretary may require.
- 11 "(e) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
- 12 are authorized to be appropriated to make grants under
- 13 this section \$10,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2003,
- 14 2004 and 2005.".
