A BILL

To provide for the liquidation or reliquidation of certain entries of certain manufacturing equipment.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. DUTY RELIQUIDATION FOR CERTAIN MANU-
- 4 FACTURING EQUIPMENT.
- 5 (a) In General.—Notwithstanding sections 514 and
- 6 520 of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1514 and 1520)
- 7 or any other provision of law, not later than 90 days after
- 8 the receipt of the request described in subsection (b), any
- 9 article—

1	(1) that was entered, or withdrawn from ware-
2	house for consumption—
3	(A) on or after May 11, 1997; and
4	(B) before October 21, 1998; and
5	(2) with respect to which heading 9902.84.79,
6	9902.84.91, or 9902.84.85 of the Harmonized Tariff
7	Schedule of the United States would have applied if
8	such article had been entered, or withdrawn from
9	warehouse for consumption, on December 31, 2001,
10	shall be liquidated or reliquidated as if heading
11	9902.84.79, 9902.84.91, or 9902.84.85, whichever is ap-
12	plicable, applied to such entry or withdrawal, and the Sec-
13	retary of the Treasury shall refund any excess duty paid
14	with respect to such entry.
15	(b) Requests.—Liquidation or reliquidation may be
16	made under subsection (a) with respect to any entry only
17	if a request therefor is filed with the Customs Service,
18	within 180 days after the date of enactment of this Act,
19	that contains sufficient information to enable the Customs
20	Service—
21	(1) to locate the entry; or
22	(2) to reconstruct the entry if it cannot be lo-
23	cated.
