 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Preservation of Civil
 - 5 Rights Protections Act of 2002".
 - 6 SEC. 2. AMENDMENT TO FEDERAL ARBITRATION ACT.
 - 7 Section 1 of title 9, United States Code, is amended
 - 8 by striking "of seamen" and all that follows through
 - 9 "commerce".

SEC. 3. UNENFORCEABILITY OF ARBITRATION CLAUSES IN 2 EMPLOYMENT CONTRACTS. 3 (a) Protection of Employee Rights.—Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any clause of any 4 5 agreement between an employer and an employee that requires arbitration of a dispute arising under the Constitu-6 tion or laws of the United States shall not be enforceable. 8 (b) Exceptions.— 9 Waiver or consent after dispute 10 ARISES.—Subsection (a) shall not apply with respect 11 to any dispute if, after such dispute arises, the par-12 ties involved knowingly and voluntarily consent to 13 submit such dispute to arbitration. 14 (2) Collective Bargaining agreements.— 15 Subsection (a) shall not preclude an employee or 16 union from enforcing any of the rights or terms of 17 a valid collective bargaining agreement. 18 SEC. 4. APPLICATION OF AMENDMENTS. 19 This Act and the amendment made by section 2 shall 20 apply with respect to all employment contracts in force
