A BILL

- To amend the Small Business Act to direct the Administrator of the Small Business Administration to establish a pilot program to provide regulatory compliance assistance to small business concerns, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "National Small Busi-
 - 5 ness Regulatory Assistance Act of 2002".
 - 6 SEC. 2. PURPOSE.
 - 7 The purpose of this Act is to establish a pilot pro-
 - 8 gram to—

1	(1) provide confidential assistance to small
2	business concerns;
3	(2) provide small business concerns with the in-
4	formation necessary to improve their rate of compli-
5	ance with Federal and State regulations;
6	(3) create a partnership among Federal agen-
7	cies to increase outreach efforts to small business
8	concerns with respect to regulatory compliance;
9	(4) provide a mechanism for unbiased feedback
10	to Federal agencies on the regulatory environment
11	for small business concerns; and
12	(5) utilize the service delivery network of Small
13	Business Development Centers to improve access of
14	small business concerns to programs to assist them
15	with regulatory compliance.
16	SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.
17	In this Act, the definitions set forth in section 36(a)
18	of the Small Business Act (as added by section 4 of this
19	Act) shall apply.
20	SEC. 4. SMALL BUSINESS REGULATORY ASSISTANCE PILOT
21	PROGRAM.
22	The Small Business Act (15 U.S.C. 637 et seq.) is
23	amended—
24	(1) by redesignating section 36 as section 37;
25	and

I	(2) by inserting after section 35 the following
2	new section:
3	"SEC. 36. SMALL BUSINESS REGULATORY ASSISTANCE
4	PILOT PROGRAM.
5	"(a) Definitions.—In this section, the following
6	definitions apply:
7	"(1) Administrator.—The term 'Adminis-
8	trator' means the Administrator of the Small Busi-
9	ness Administration, acting through the Associate
10	Administrator for Small Business Development Cen-
11	ters.
12	"(2) Association.—The term 'Association'
13	means the association, established pursuant to sec-
14	tion 21(a)(3)(A), representing a majority of Small
15	Business Development Centers.
16	"(3) Participating small business devel-
17	OPMENT CENTER.—The term 'participating Small
18	Business Development Center' means a Small Busi-
19	ness Development Center participating in the pilot
20	program.
21	"(4) PILOT PROGRAM.—The term 'pilot pro-
22	gram' means the pilot program established under
23	this section.
24	"(5) REGULATORY COMPLIANCE ASSISTANCE.—
25	The term 'regulatory compliance assistance' means

- 1 assistance provided by a Small Business Develop-
- 2 ment Center to a small business concern to enable
- 3 the concern to comply with Federal regulatory re-
- 4 quirements.
- 5 "(6) Small business development cen-
- 6 Ter.—The term 'Small Business Development Cen-
- 7 ter' means a Small Business Development Center
- 8 described in section 21.
- 9 "(7) STATE.—The term 'State' means each of
- the several States, the District of Columbia, the
- 11 Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands,
- and Guam.
- 13 "(b) AUTHORITY.—In accordance with this section,
- 14 the Administrator shall establish a pilot program to pro-
- 15 vide regulatory compliance assistance to small business
- 16 concerns through participating Small Business Develop-
- 17 ment Centers, the Association, and Federal compliance
- 18 partnership programs.
- 19 "(c) Small Business Development Centers.—
- 20 "(1) In general.—In carrying out the pilot
- 21 program, the Administrator shall enter into arrange-
- 22 ments with participating Small Business Develop-
- 23 ment Centers under which such centers will
- 24 provide—

1	"(A) access to information and resources
2	including current Federal and State nonpuni-
3	tive compliance and technical assistance pro-
4	grams similar to those established under section
5	507 of the Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990
6	(42 U.S.C. 7661f);
7	"(B) training and educational activities;
8	"(C) confidential, free-of-charge, one-on-
9	one, in-depth counseling to the owners and op-
10	erators of small business concerns regarding
11	compliance with Federal and State regulations
12	provided that such counseling is not considered
13	to be the practice of law in a State in which a
14	Small Business Development Center is located
15	or in which such counseling is conducted;
16	"(D) technical assistance; and
17	"(E) referrals to experts and other pro-
18	viders of compliance assistance who meet such
19	standards for educational, technical, and profes-
20	sional competency as are established by the Ad-
21	ministrator.
22	"(2) Reports.—
23	"(A) In General.—Each participating
24	Small Business Development Center shall trans-

1	mit to the Administrator a quarterly report that
2	includes—
3	"(i) a summary of the regulatory com-
4	pliance assistance provided by the center
5	under the pilot program; and
6	"(ii) any data and information ob-
7	tained by the center from a Federal agency
8	regarding regulatory compliance that the
9	agency intends to be disseminated to small
10	business concerns.
11	"(B) Electronic form.—Each report re-
12	ferred to in subparagraph (A) shall be trans-
13	mitted in electronic form.
14	"(C) Interim reports.—During any time
15	period falling between the transmittal of quar-
16	terly reports, a participating Small Business
17	Development Center may transmit to the Ad-
18	ministrator any interim report containing data
19	or information considered by the center to be
20	necessary or useful.
21	"(D) Limitation on disclosure re-
22	QUIREMENTS.—The Administrator may not re-
23	quire a Small Business Development Center to
24	disclose the name or address of any small busi-
25	ness concern that received or is receiving assist-

1	ance under the pilot program, except that the
2	Administrator shall require such a disclosure if
3	ordered to do so by a court in any civil or
4	criminal enforcement action commenced by a
5	Federal or State agency.
6	"(d) Data Repository and Clearinghouse.—
7	"(1) In general.—In carrying out the pilot
8	program, the Administrator shall—
9	"(A) act as the repository of and clearing-
10	house for data and information submitted by
11	Small Business Development Centers; and
12	"(B) transmit to the President and to the
13	Committees on Small Business of the Senate
14	and House of Representatives an annual report
15	that includes—
16	"(i) a description of the types of as-
17	sistance provided by participating Small
18	Business Development Centers under the
19	pilot program;
20	"(ii) data regarding the number of
21	small business concerns that contacted
22	participating Small Business Development
23	Centers regarding assistance under the
24	pilot program;

1	"(iii) data regarding the number of
2	small business concerns assisted by partici-
3	pating Small Business Development Cen-
4	ters under the pilot program;
5	"(iv) data and information regarding
6	outreach activities conducted by partici-
7	pating Small Business Development Cen-
8	ters under the pilot program, including any
9	activities conducted in partnership with
10	Federal agencies;
11	"(v) data and information regarding
12	each case known to the Administrator in
13	which one or more Small Business Devel-
14	opment Centers offered conflicting advice
15	or information regarding compliance with a
16	Federal or State regulation to one or more
17	small business concerns;
18	"(vi) any recommendations for im-
19	provements in the regulation of small busi-
20	ness concerns; and
21	"(vii) a list of regulations identified
22	by the Administrator, after consultation
23	with the Small Business and Agriculture
24	Regulatory Enforcement Ombudsman, as
25	being most burdensome to small business

1	concerns, and recommendations to reduce
2	or eliminate the burdens of such regula-
3	tions.
4	"(e) Eligibility.—
5	"(1) In general.—A Small Business Develop-
6	ment Center shall be eligible to receive assistance
7	under the pilot program only if the center is certified
8	under section $21(k)(2)$.
9	"(2) Waiver.—With respect to a Small Busi-
10	ness Development Center seeking assistance under
11	the pilot program, the Administrator may waive the
12	certification requirement set forth in paragraph (1)
13	if the Administrator determines that the center is
14	making a good faith effort to obtain such certifi-
15	cation.
16	"(3) Effective date.—This subsection shall
17	take effect on October 1, 2002.
18	"(f) Selection of Participating State Pro-
19	GRAMS.—
20	"(1) In General.—In consultation with the
21	Association and giving substantial weight to the As-
22	sociation's recommendations, the Administrator shall
23	select the Small Business Development Center pro-
24	grams of 2 States from each of the following groups

1	of States to participate in the pilot program estab-
2	lished by this section:
3	"(A) Group 1: Maine, Massachusetts, New
4	Hampshire, Connecticut, Vermont, and Rhode
5	Island.
6	"(B) Group 2: New York, New Jersey
7	Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands.
8	"(C) Group 3: Pennsylvania, Maryland,
9	West Virginia, Virginia, the District of Colum-
10	bia, and Delaware.
11	"(D) Group 4: Georgia, Alabama, North
12	Carolina, South Carolina, Mississippi, Florida,
13	Kentucky, and Tennessee.
14	"(E) Group 5: Illinois, Ohio, Michigan, In-
15	diana, Wisconsin, and Minnesota.
16	"(F) Group 6: Texas, New Mexico, Arkan-
17	sas, Oklahoma, and Louisiana.
18	"(G) Group 7: Missouri, Iowa, Nebraska
19	and Kansas.
20	"(H) Group 8: Colorado, Wyoming, North
21	Dakota, South Dakota, Montana, and Utah.
22	"(I) Group 9: California, Guam, Hawaii
23	Nevada, and Arizona.
24	"(J) Group 10: Washington, Alaska,
25	Idaho and Oregon

1	"(2) Deadline for selection.—The Admin-
2	istrator shall make selections under this subsection
3	not later than 60 days after promulgation of regula-
4	tions under section 5 of the National Small Business
5	Regulatory Assistance Act of 2002.
6	"(g) Matching Not Required.—Subparagraphs
7	(A) and (B) of section 21(a)(4) shall not apply to assist-
8	ance made available under the pilot program.
9	"(h) Distribution of Grants.—
10	"(1) In General.—Each State program se-
11	lected to receive a grant under subsection (f) in a
12	fiscal year shall be eligible to receive a grant in an
13	amount not to exceed the product obtained by
14	multiplying—
15	"(A) the amount made available for grants
16	under this section for the fiscal year; and
17	"(B) the ratio that—
18	"(i) the population of the State; bears
19	to
20	"(ii) the population of all the States
21	with programs selected to receive grants
22	under subsection (f) for the fiscal year.
23	"(2) MINIMUM AMOUNT.—Notwithstanding
24	paragraph (1), the minimum amount that a State
25	program selected to receive a grant under subsection

- 1 (f) shall be eligible to receive under this section in
- the fiscal year shall be \$200,000.
- 3 "(i) EVALUATION AND REPORT.—Not later than 3
- 4 years after the establishment of the pilot program, the
- 5 Comptroller General of the United States shall conduct
- 6 an evaluation of the pilot program and shall transmit to
- 7 the Administrator and to the Committees on Small Busi-
- 8 ness of the Senate and House of Representatives a report
- 9 containing the results of the evaluation along with any rec-
- 10 ommendations as to whether the pilot program, with or
- 11 without modification, should be extended to include the
- 12 participation of all Small Business Development Centers.
- 13 "(j) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—
- 14 "(1) IN GENERAL.—There are authorized to be
- appropriated to carry out this section \$5,000,000 for
- 16 fiscal year 2003 and each fiscal year thereafter.
- 17 "(2) Limitation on use of other funds.—
- 18 The Administrator may carry out the pilot program
- only with amounts appropriated in advance specifi-
- cally to carry out this section.".

21 SEC. 5. PROMULGATION OF REGULATIONS.

- After providing notice and an opportunity for com-
- 23 ment and after consulting with the Association (but not
- 24 later than 180 days after the date of the enactment of
- 25 this Act), the Administrator shall promulgate final regula-

1	tions to carry out this Act, including regulations that
2	establish—
3	(1) priorities for the types of assistance to be
4	provided under the pilot program;
5	(2) standards relating to educational, technical,
6	and support services to be provided by participating
7	Small Business Development Centers;
8	(3) standards relating to any national service
9	delivery and support function to be provided by the
10	Association under the pilot program;
11	(4) standards relating to any work plan that
12	the Administrator may require a participating Small
13	Business Development Center to develop; and
14	(5) standards relating to the educational, tech-
15	nical, and professional competency of any expert or
16	other assistance provider to whom a small business
17	concern may be referred for compliance assistance
18	under the pilot program.
19	SEC. 6. PRIVACY REQUIREMENTS APPLICABLE TO SMALL
20	BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT CENTERS.
21	Section 21(e) of the Small Business Act (15 U.S.C.
22	648(e)) is amended by adding at the end the following:
23	"(9) Privacy requirements.—
24	"(A) In General.—No Small Business
25	Development Center, consortium of Small Busi-

1	ness Development Centers, or contractor or
2	agent of a Small Business Development Center
3	shall disclose the name or address of any indi-
4	vidual or small business concern receiving as-
5	sistance under this section without the consent
6	of such individual or small business concern, ex-
7	cept that—
8	"(i) the Administrator shall require
9	such disclosure if ordered to do so by a
10	court in any civil or criminal enforcement
11	action commenced by a Federal or State
12	agency; and
13	"(ii) if the Administrator considers it
14	necessary while undertaking a financial
15	audit of a Small Business Development
16	Center, the Administrator shall require
17	such disclosure for the sole purpose of un-
18	dertaking such audit.
19	"(B) REGULATIONS.—The Administrator
20	shall issue regulations to establish standards for
21	requiring disclosures during a financial audit

under subparagraph (A)(ii).".

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
