2	FROM DEFINITION OF FOREIGN POWER IN
3	FOREIGN INTELLIGENCE SURVEILLANCE ACT
4	OF 1978 RELATING TO INTERNATIONAL TER-
5	RORISM.
6	Paragraph (4) of section 101(a) of the Foreign Intel-
7	ligence Surveillance Act of 1978 (50 U.S.C. 1801(a)) is
8	amended to read as follows:
9	"(4) any person, other than a United States
10	person, or group that is engaged in international ter-
11	rorism or activities in preparation therefor;".
