Mr. Burns introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Armed Services

A BILL

To redesignate the position of the Secretary of the Navy as the Secretary of the Navy and Marine Corps, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. FINDINGS.
- 4 Congress finds the following:
- 5 (1) On November 10, 1775, the Continental
- 6 Congress meeting in Philadelphia passed a resolu-
- 7 tion directing that "two Battalions of Marines be
- 8 raised" for service as landing forces with the fleet,
- 9 thereby establishing the Continental Marines and

- signifying the birth of the United States MarineCorps.
- (2) The Marines throughout the Nation's history have often been called upon to be the first into battle and have accepted this duty without hesitation and with a sense of honor and esprit de corps that is second to none.
 - (3) Marine Corps units constitute approximately 20 percent of the United States military's active ground maneuver battalions, 20 percent of the active fighter/attack squadrons, 17 percent of the attack helicopters, and nearly one third of the ground combat service support in the active forces.
 - (4) Throughout the 226-year history of the Navy and Marine Corps, they have fought side by side as a cohesive team against any interests that would do the Nation harm.
 - (5) The Marine Corps is the only service in the Department of Defense without a specific service Secretary.
 - (6) The Secretary of the Navy serves as both the Secretary of the Navy and Secretary of the Marine Corps.

1 SEC. 2. CHANGE IN TITLE OF SECRETARY OF THE NAVY.

- 2 (a) Change in Title.—The position of the Sec-
- 3 retary of the Navy is hereby redesignated as the Secretary
- 4 of the Navy and Marine Corps.
- 5 (b) References.—Any reference to the Secretary of
- 6 the Navy in any law, regulation, document, record, or
- 7 other paper of the United States shall be considered to
- 8 be a reference to the Secretary of the Navy and Marine
- 9 Corps.
