Mrs. CLINTON introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Finance

A BILL

To amend title XVI of the Social Security Act to provide that annuities paid by States to blind veterans shall be disregarded in determining supplemental security income benefits.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. STATE ANNUITIES FOR BLIND VETERANS TO BE**

4 **DISREGARDED IN DETERMINING SUPPLE-**

5 **MENTAL SECURITY INCOME BENEFITS.**

6 (a) INCOME DISREGARD.—Section 1612(b) of the So-

7 cial Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1382a(b)) is amended—

1 (1) by striking “and” at the end of paragraph
2 (21);

5 (3) by adding at the end the following:

6 “(23) any annuity paid by a State to the individual
7 (or such spouse) on the basis of the individual’s being a veteran (as defined in section 101 of
8 title 38, United States Code) and blind, if a law of
9 such State providing for such an annuity was in effect
10 on the date of the enactment of this paragraph.”.

13 (b) RESOURCE DISREGARD.—Section 1613(a) of
14 such Act (42 U.S.C. 1382b(a)) is amended—

15 (1) by striking “and” at the end of paragraph
16 (12):

17 (2) by striking the period at the end of para-
18 graph (13) and inserting “; and”; and

19 (3) by inserting after paragraph (13) the fol-
20 lowing:

21 “(14) for the month of receipt and every month
22 thereafter, any annuity paid by a State to the indi-
23 vidual (or such spouse) on the basis of the individ-
24 ual’s being a veteran (as defined in section 101 of
25 title 38, United States Code) and blind, if a law of

1 such State providing for such an annuity was in ef-
2 fect on the date of the enactment of this para-
3 graph.”.

4 (c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
5 this section shall apply to benefits paid for months begin-
6 ning after the date of the enactment of this Act.
