A BILL

- To designate Fort Bayard Historic District in the State of New Mexico as a National Historic Landmark, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Fort Bayard National
- 5 Historic Landmark Act".

1 SEC. 2. CONGRESSIONAL FINDINGS.

2	The Congress finds that—				
3	(1) Fort Bayard, located in southwest New				
4	Mexico, was an Army post from 1866 until 1899,				
5	and served an important role in the settlement o				
6	New Mexico;				
7	(2) among the troops stationed at the fort were				
8	several "Buffalo Soldier" units who fought in the				
9	Apache Wars;				
10	(3) following its closure as a military post, For				
11	Bayard was established by the War Department as				
12	general hospital for use as a military sanatorium;				
13	(4) in 1965 the State of New Mexico assumed				
14	management of the site and currently operates the				
15	Fort Bayard State Hospital;				
16	(5) the Fort Bayard historic site has been listed				
17	on the National Register of Historic Places in rec				
18	ognition of the national significance of its history,				
19	both as a military fort and as an historic medical fa-				
20	cility.				
21	SEC. 3. FORT BAYARD NATIONAL HISTORIC LANDMARK.				
22	(a) Designation.—The Fort Bayard Historic Dis-				
23	trict in Grant County, New Mexico, as listed on the Na-				
24	tional Register of Historic Places, is hereby designated as				
25	the Fort Bayard National Historic Landmark.				

(b) Administration.—

- 1 (1) Consistent with the Department of the Inte-2 rior's regulations concerning National Historic
- 3 Landmarks (36 C.F.R. Part 65), designation of the
- 4 Fort Bayard Historic District as a National Historic
- 5 Landmark shall not prohibit under Federal law or
- 6 regulations any actions which may otherwise be
- 7 taken by the property owner with respect to the
- 8 property.
- 9 (2) Nothing in this Act shall affect the adminis-
- tration of the Fort Bayard Historic District by the
- 11 State of New Mexico

12 SEC. 4. COOPERATIVE AGREEMENTS.

- 13 (a) In General.—The Secretary, in consultation
- 14 with the State of New Mexico, may enter into cooperative
- 15 agreements with appropriate public or private entities, for
- 16 the purposes of protecting historic resources at Fort Bay-
- 17 and and providing educational and interpretive facilities
- 18 and programs for the public. The Secretary shall not enter
- 19 into any agreement or provide assistance to any activity
- 20 affecting Fort Bayard State Hospital without the concur-
- 21 rence of the State of New Mexico.
- 22 (b) Technical and Financial Assistance.—The
- 23 Secretary may provide technical and financial assistance
- 24 with any entity with which the Secretary has entered into

- 1 a cooperative agreement under subsection (a) in further-
- 2 ance of the agreement.
- 3 SEC. 5. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.
- 4 There is authorized to be appropriated such sums as
- 5 may be necessary to carry out this Act.
