7	Section 901 of the Economic Growth and Tax Relief
8	Reconciliation Act of 2001 is amended by adding at the
9	end the following new subsection:
10	"(c) Exception.—Subsection (a) shall not apply to
11	the amendments made by section 412 (relating to elimi-
12	nation of 60-month limit and increase in income limitation
13	on student loan interest deduction).".
